### **Definitions of "Tenement" as a noun**

- *(especially in Scotland or the US) a room or a set of rooms forming a separate residence within a house or block of flats.*
- *Any kind of permanent property, e.g. lands or rents, held from a superior.*
- *A run-down apartment house barely meeting minimal standards.*
- *A house divided into and let as separate residences.*
- *A piece of land held by an owner.*

<b><u>bedroom</u></b>	A room for sleeping in. <i>A two <b>bedroom</b> flat.</i>
<b>boarding</b>	Long, flat, thin pieces of wood used to build or cover something. <i>Students all had to pay <b>boarding</b> fees.</i>
<b><u>ceiling</u></b>	The upper interior surface of a room or other similar compartment. <i>He put a <b>ceiling</b> on the number of women who worked for him.</i>
<b><u>cottage</u></b>	(in the context of casual homosexual encounters) a public toilet. <i>They said that at some point in their lives they ve <b>cottaged</b> or cruised in parks.</i>

<b>domesticity</b>	Domestic activities or life. <i>Making a hobby of <b>domesticity</b>.</i>
<b>domicile</b>	Law the residence where you have your permanent home or principal establishment and to where whenever you are absent you intend to return every person is compelled to have one and only one domicile at a time. <i>His wife has a <b>domicile</b> of origin in Germany.</i>
<b>doorstep</b>	(of a journalist) wait uninvited outside the home of (someone) in order to obtain an interview or photograph. <i><b>Doorstep</b> sandwiches.</i>
<b>doorway</b>	The entrance (the space in a wall) through which you enter or leave a room or building; the space that a door can close. <i>He stuck his head in the <b>doorway</b>.</i>
<b>duplex</b>	Having two parts used technically of a device or process duplex adj allowing communication in opposite directions simultaneously. <i>A <b>duplex</b> transaction.</i>
<b>dwelling</b>	A house, flat, or other place of residence. <i>The proposed <b>dwelling</b> is out of keeping with those nearby.</i>
<b>edifice</b>	A complex system of beliefs. <i>It was an imposing <b>edifice</b>.</i>
<b>farmstead</b>	A farm together with its buildings.
<b>furnished</b>	Provided with whatever is necessary for a purpose (as furniture or equipment or authority). <i>A completely <b>furnished</b> toolbox.</i>
<b>habitable</b>	Fit for habitation. <i>The <b>habitable</b> world.</i>
<b>habitation</b>	The fact of living in a particular place. <i>Signs of human <b>habitation</b>.</i>
<b>homestead</b>	Settle land given by the government and occupy it as a homestead.
<b>hut</b>	Provide with huts. <i>A beach <b>hut</b>.</i>
<b>indoors</b>	Within a building. <i>They went <b>indoors</b> and explored the house.</i>
<b>lodging</b>	The act of lodging. <i>He was looking for <b>lodgings</b> and a job.</i>
<b>manor</b>	One's own neighbourhood or area of operation. <i>The right to mine ores within the <b>manor</b> of Little Langdale.</i>

<b><u>mansion</u></b>	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle <b>Mansions</b>.</i>
<b>mews</b>	Street lined with buildings that were originally private stables but have been remodeled as dwellings. <i>An eighteenth century <b>mews</b>.</i>
<b><u>neighborhood</u></b>	People living near one another. <i>My <b>neighborhood</b> voted for Bush.</i>
<b>patio</b>	Usually paved outdoor area adjoining a residence. <i>A <b>patio</b> table and chairs.</i>
<b><u>residence</u></b>	A person's home, especially a large and impressive one. <i>The youth hostel has been adapted from a private <b>residence</b>.</i>
<b>tepee</b>	A portable conical tent made of skins, cloth, or canvas on a frame of poles, used by North American Indians of the Plains and Great Lakes regions.
<b>toga</b>	A loose flowing outer garment worn by the citizens of ancient Rome, made of a single piece of cloth and covering the whole body apart from the right arm.
<b>treetop</b>	The uppermost part of a tree.
