## Tent as a Noun

### Definitions of "Tent" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “tent” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A web that resembles a tent or carpet.*
- *A portable shelter made of cloth, supported by one or more poles and stretched tight by cords or loops attached to pegs driven into the ground.*
- *A portable shelter (usually of canvas stretched over supporting poles and fastened to the ground with ropes and pegs.*

- barracks** A building or group of buildings used to house military personnel.

- station** A bus or coach station.  
*The train pulled into the **station**.*

## Tent as a Verb

### Definitions of "Tent" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "tent" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Live or stay for a while in a tent.*
- *Arrange in a shape like that of a tent.*
- *Cover with or as if with a tent.*
- *Live in or as if in a tent.*



## Synonyms of "Tent" as a verb (4 Words)

- bivouac** Stay in a bivouac.  
*We **bivouacked** on the north side of the town.*
- camp** Establish or set up a camp.  
*We **camped** out for the night in a mission schoolroom.*
- camp out** Give an artificially banal or sexual quality to.
- encamp** Live in or as if in a tent.  
*We **encamped** for the night by a river.*



## Usage Examples of "Tent" as a verb

- *The circus tented near the town.*
- *The garden had been completely tented over for supper.*
- *We tented with the kids on the shores of Lake Huron.*
- *Tim tented his fingers.*



## Associations of "Tent" (30 Words)

- accommodation** The available space for occupants in a building, vehicle, or vessel.  
*They were living in temporary **accommodation**.*
- bivouac** Stay in a bivouac.

- boarding** A structure of boards.

<b>clique</b>	An exclusive circle of people with a common purpose. <i>The old school <b>clique</b>.</i>
<b>coterie</b>	A small group of people with shared interests or tastes, especially one that is exclusive of other people. <i>A <b>coterie</b> of friends and advisers.</i>
<b>encamp</b>	Settle in or establish a camp. <i>We <b>encamped</b> for the night by a river.</i>
<b>encampment</b>	A prehistoric enclosed or fortified site, especially an Iron Age hill fort. <i>A Bedouin <b>encampment</b>.</i>
<b>fireplace</b>	A structure surrounding a fireplace. <i>A chipped tile <b>fireplace</b>.</i>
<b>forest</b>	Denoting an area that was formerly a royal forest. <i>A <b>forest</b> of high rise apartments.</i>
<b>ground</b>	With reference to a ship run or go aground. <i>He <b>grounded</b> to second.</i>
<b>hammock</b>	A hanging bed of canvas or rope netting (usually suspended between two trees); swings easily.
<b>hiking</b>	A long walk usually for exercise or pleasure. <i>She enjoys <b>hiking</b> and climbing in her spare time.</i>
<b>house</b>	The management of a gambling house or casino. <i>The children were playing <b>house</b>.</i>
<b>hovel</b>	A conical building enclosing a kiln. <i>People were living in rat infested <b>hovels</b>.</i>
<b>hut</b>	Provide with huts. <i>A beach <b>hut</b>.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>The man who <b>lodged</b> in the room next door.</i>
<b>lodging</b>	The act of lodging. <i>He was looking for <b>lodgings</b> and a job.</i>
<b>mountain</b>	A land mass that projects well above its surroundings; higher than a hill. <i>They sought refuge in the <b>mountains</b>.</i>
<b>outside</b>	Leading to or from the outside. <i>An <b>outside</b> chance.</i>
<b>pole</b>	Propel with a pole. <i>They tell you on the tin that their tuna is entirely caught with <b>pole</b> and line.</i>
<b>savanna</b>	A flat grassland in tropical or subtropical regions.



**shanty**

A small, crudely built shack.

**tepee**

A Native American tent; usually of conical shape.

**tipi**

A Native American tent; usually of conical shape.

**travel**

A period of time spent travelling from one place to another typically over long distances.

*He enjoyed selling but he hated the **travel**.*

**vacation**

Spend or take a vacation.

*I was **vacationing** in Europe with my family.*
