- A portable shelter made of cloth, supported by one or more poles and stretched tight by cords or loops attached to pegs driven into the ground.
- A portable shelter (usually of canvas stretched over supporting poles and fastened to the ground with ropes and pegs.

#### Definitions of "Tent" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "tent" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Live or stay for a while in a tent.
- Arrange in a shape like that of a tent.
- Cover with or as if with a tent.
- Live in or as if in a tent.





## Synonyms of "Tent" as a verb (4 Words)

**bivouac** Stay in a bivouac.

We **bivouac**ked on the north side of the town.

Establish or set up a camp.

We samped out for the piel

We **camp**ed out for the night in a mission schoolroom.

camp out Give an artificially banal or sexual quality to.

encamp Live in or as if in a tent.

We **encamp**ed for the night by a river.

- We tented with the kids on the shores of Lake Huron.
- Tim tented his fingers.
