Definitions of "Tentacle" as a noun

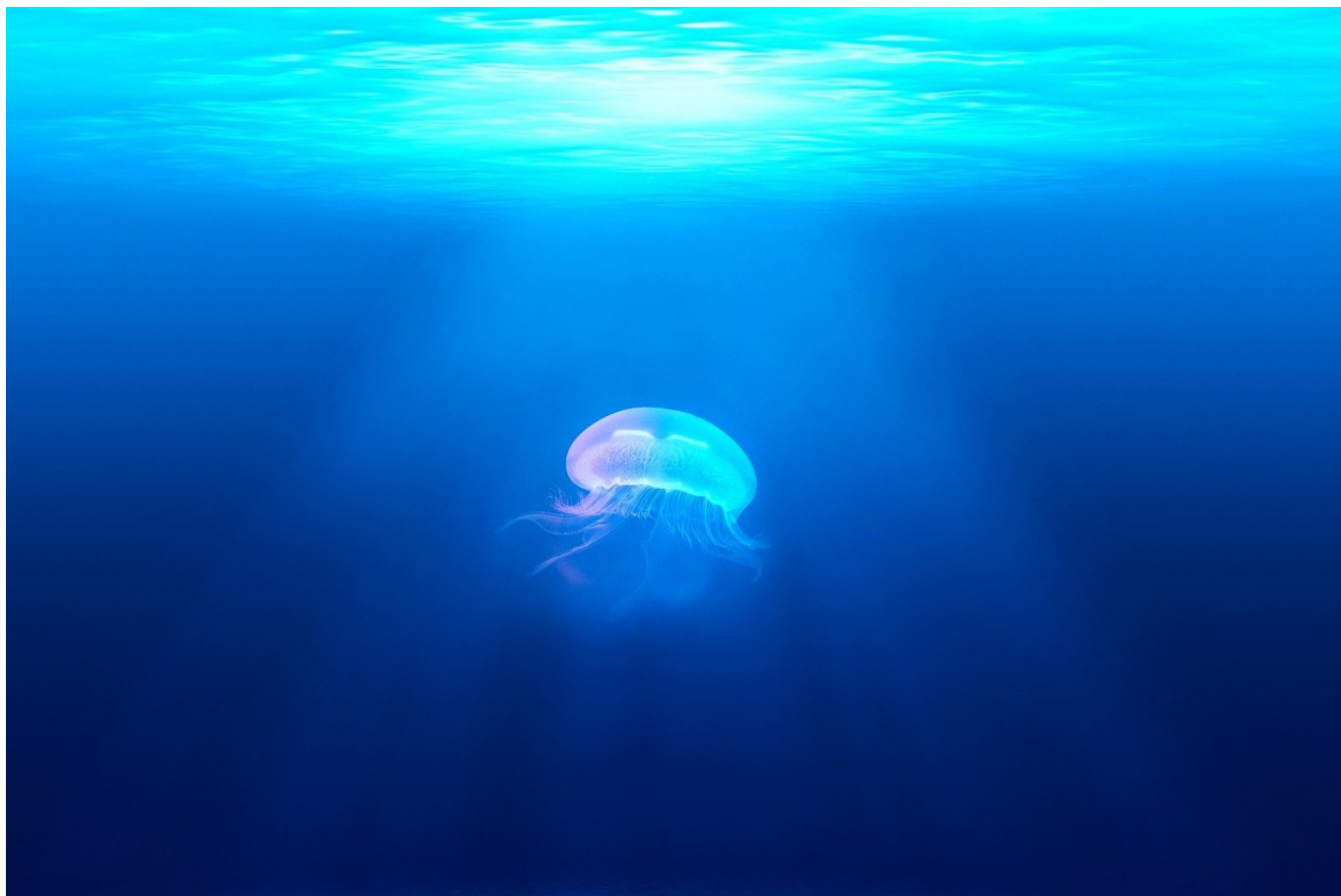
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “tentacle” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Any of various elongated tactile or prehensile flexible organs that occur on the head or near the mouth in many animals; used for feeling or grasping or locomotion.*
- *A slender, flexible limb or appendage in an animal, especially around the mouth of an invertebrate, used for grasping or moving about, or bearing sense organs.*
- *Something resembling a tentacle in shape or flexibility.*
- *Something that acts like a tentacle in its ability to grasp and hold.*
- *(in a plant) a tendril or a sensitive glandular hair.*
- *An insidious spread of influence and control.*



Synonyms of "Tentacle" as a noun (2 Words)

- antenna** An electrical device that sends or receives radio or television signals.
*Bugs use their **antennae** to detect blood heat.*
- horn** A projection resembling a horn on the head of another animal e g a snail s
tentacle or the tuft of a horned owl.
***Horns** at the ends of a new moon.*

- *Caught in the tentacles of organized crime.*
- *The Party's tentacles reached into every nook and cranny of people's lives.*
