Synonyms of "Terrain" as a noun (3 Words)

- ground** The part of a scene or picture that lies behind objects in the foreground.
Ground flora.
- land** Extensive landed property especially in the country retained by the owner for his own use.
Waste land.
- territory** An area of knowledge, activity, or experience.
*Don't go committing murders on my **territory**.*

- *A terrain of low green hills.*
- *A mind trying to find its way through difficult theoretical and political terrain.*

acre	A unit of area (4840 square yards) used in English-speaking countries. <i>Acres of space.</i>
acreage	An area of ground used for some particular purpose (such as building or farming). <i>A 35 per cent increase in net acreage.</i>
ambit	An area in which something acts or operates or has power or control. <i>A full discussion of this complex issue was beyond the ambit of one book.</i>
area	A particular environment or walk of life. <i>The dining area.</i>
clearing	A tract of land with few or no trees in the middle of a wooded area.
<u>constituency</u>	A group of voters in a specified area who elect a representative to a legislative body. <i>A parliamentary candidate in the Hampstead and Highgate constituency.</i>
continent	One of the large landmasses of the earth. <i>Pioneers had to cross the continent on foot.</i>

continental	Forming or belonging to a continent. <i>Continental Europe.</i>
demesne	Extensive landed property (especially in the country) retained by the owner for his own use. <i>A levy of one tenth on property in the royal demesne.</i>
district	Regulate housing in; of certain areas of towns. <i>A district health authority.</i>
domain	A discrete region of magnetism in ferromagnetic material. <i>The French domains of the Plantagenets.</i>
equatorial	Of or relating to or at an equator. <i>Equatorial Africa.</i>
geographic	Determined by geography. <i>The north and south geographic poles.</i>
geographical	Relating to geography. <i>The geographical area covered by the Diocese.</i>
geography	(especially in business) a geographical area; a region. <i>The geography of post war London.</i>
hectare	A unit of surface area equal to 100 ares (or 10,000 square meters).
knoll	A small natural hill. <i>A grassy knoll.</i>
land	Put someone or something on land from a boat. <i>He landed several blows on his opponent's head.</i>
localization	The principle that specific functions have relatively circumscribed locations in some particular part or organ of the body. <i>Differences in localization of growth control molecules in carcinoma.</i>
national	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i>Plans for a national art library.</i>
physiography	The study of physical features of the earth's surface.
plat	Make a plat of. <i>They looked out over the plats of dark ground.</i>
prefecture	A prefect's office or tenure. <i>Enraged fans besieged the Prefecture of Police.</i>
province	The territory occupied by one of the constituent administrative districts of a nation. <i>I made my way home to the dreary provinces by train.</i>
reconnoiter	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.

- region** The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of.
*It was going to take in the **region** of two or three months to finish the job.*
- southern** Situated in or coming from regions of the south.
***Southern** constellations.*
- subdivide** Form into subdivisions.
*The heading was **subdivided** into eight separate sections.*
- territory** An area of knowledge or interest.
*The way she felt now she was in unknown **territory**.*
- zoning** Dividing an area into zones or sections reserved for different purposes such as residence and business and manufacturing etc.
*The property s **zoning** would allow taller buildings than proposed.*
