- land** Extensive landed property especially in the country retained by the owner for his own use.  
*Waste land.*
- territory** An area of knowledge, activity, or experience.  
*Don't go committing murders on my **territory**.*

## Associations of "Terrain" (30 Words)

<b>acre</b>	A unit of area (4840 square yards) used in English-speaking countries. <i>Acres of space.</i>
<b>acreage</b>	An area of ground used for some particular purpose (such as building or farming). <i>A 35 per cent increase in net <b>acreage</b>.</i>
<b>ambit</b>	An area in which something acts or operates or has power or control. <i>A full discussion of this complex issue was beyond the <b>ambit</b> of one book.</i>
<b>area</b>	A particular environment or walk of life. <i>The dining <b>area</b>.</i>
<b>clearing</b>	A tract of land with few or no trees in the middle of a wooded area.
<b><u>constituency</u></b>	A group of voters in a specified area who elect a representative to a legislative body. <i>A parliamentary candidate in the Hampstead and Highgate <b>constituency</b>.</i>
<b>continent</b>	One of the large landmasses of the earth. <i>Pioneers had to cross the <b>continent</b> on foot.</i>

<b>continental</b>	Forming or belonging to a continent. <i><b>Continental</b> Europe.</i>
<b>demesne</b>	Extensive landed property (especially in the country) retained by the owner for his own use. <i>A levy of one tenth on property in the royal <b>demesne</b>.</i>
<b>district</b>	Regulate housing in; of certain areas of towns. <i>A <b>district</b> health authority.</i>
<b>domain</b>	A discrete region of magnetism in ferromagnetic material. <i>The French <b>domains</b> of the Plantagenets.</i>
<b>equatorial</b>	Of or relating to or at an equator. <i><b>Equatorial</b> Africa.</i>
<b>geographic</b>	Determined by geography. <i>The north and south <b>geographic</b> poles.</i>
<b>geographical</b>	Relating to geography. <i>The <b>geographical</b> area covered by the Diocese.</i>
<b>geography</b>	(especially in business) a geographical area; a region. <i>The <b>geography</b> of post war London.</i>
<b>hectare</b>	A unit of surface area equal to 100 ares (or 10,000 square meters).
<b>knoll</b>	A small natural hill. <i>A grassy <b>knoll</b>.</i>
<b>land</b>	Put someone or something on land from a boat. <i>He <b>landed</b> several blows on his opponent's head.</i>
<b>localization</b>	The principle that specific functions have relatively circumscribed locations in some particular part or organ of the body. <i>Differences in <b>localization</b> of growth control molecules in carcinoma.</i>
<b>national</b>	A national newspaper as opposed to a local one. <i>Plans for a <b>national</b> art library.</i>
<b>physiography</b>	The study of physical features of the earth's surface.
<b>plat</b>	Make a plat of. <i>They looked out over the <b>plats</b> of dark ground.</i>
<b>prefecture</b>	A prefect's office or tenure. <i>Enraged fans besieged the <b>Prefecture</b> of Police.</i>
<b>province</b>	The territory occupied by one of the constituent administrative districts of a nation. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<b>reconnoiter</b>	Explore, often with the goal of finding something or somebody.



- region** The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of.  
*It was going to take in the **region** of two or three months to finish the job.*
- southern** Situated in or coming from regions of the south.  
***Southern** constellations.*
- subdivide** Form into subdivisions.  
*The heading was **subdivided** into eight separate sections.*
- territory** An area of knowledge or interest.  
*The way she felt now she was in unknown **territory**.*
- zoning** Dividing an area into zones or sections reserved for different purposes such as residence and business and manufacturing etc.  
*The property s **zoning** would allow taller buildings than proposed.*
