- frightened** Afraid or anxious.  
*The **frightened** child cowered in the corner.*
- panic-stricken** Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.
- panic-struck** Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.
- panicked** Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.  
*Felt **panicked** before each exam.*
- panicky** Feeling or characterized by uncontrollable fear or anxiety.  
*Became **panicky** as the snow deepened.*



## Usage Examples of "Terrified" as an adjective

- *The terrified horse bolted.*



## Associations of "Terrified" (30 Words)

- afraid** Filled with regret or concern; used often to soften an unpleasant statement.  
*I m **afraid** I won t be able to come.*
- alarming** Frightening because of an awareness of danger.  
*Our countryside is disappearing at an **alarming** rate.*
- appall** Fill with apprehension or alarm; cause to be unpleasantly surprised.
- astounded** Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.  
***Astounded** viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.*
- chilling** Provoking fear terror.  
*A **chilling** account of the prisoners fate.*
- claustrophobia** Extreme or irrational fear of confined places.  
*The small stuffy room had begun to give him **claustrophobia**.*

<b>coward</b>	Excessively afraid of danger or pain. <i>They had run away the <b>cowards</b>.</i>
<b>fear</b>	The likelihood of something unwelcome happening. <i>The love and <b>fear</b> of God.</i>
<b>fearfulness</b>	The trait of being afraid.
<b><u>formidable</u></b>	Inspiring fear or respect through being impressively large, powerful, intense, or capable. <i>The <b>formidable</b> prospect of major surgery.</i>
<b>fright</b>	Frighten. <i>Ghosts could never <b>affright</b> her.</i>
<b>frighten</b>	Drive out by frightening. <i>At his age I guess he doesn't <b>frighten</b> any more.</i>
<b>frightened</b>	Made afraid. <i>A <b>frightened</b> child.</i>
<b><u>frightening</u></b>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>A <b>frightening</b> experience.</i>
<b><u>gaze</u></b>	A long fixed look. <i>Offices screened from the public <b>gaze</b>.</i>
<b>horrified</b>	Filled with horror; extremely shocked. <i>The <b>horrified</b> spectators.</i>
<b><u>horror</u></b>	A thing causing a feeling of horror. <i>Photographs showed the <b>horror</b> of the tragedy.</i>
<b>intimidate</b>	To compel or deter by or as if by threats. <i>The forts are designed to <b>intimidate</b> the nationalist population.</i>
<b>overawe</b>	Subdue, restrain, or overcome by affecting with a feeling of awe; frighten (as with threats). <i>The eleven year old was <b>overawed</b> by the atmosphere.</i>
<b><u>panic</u></b>	Drive someone through panic into hasty action. <i><b>Panic</b> selling.</i>
<b>petrify</b>	Make (someone) so frightened that they are unable to move. <i>Slogans <b>petrify</b> our thinking.</i>
<b><u>scare</u></b>	Become scared. <i>I don't think I <b>scare</b> easily.</i>
<b>scared</b>	Made afraid. <i>I wasn't <b>scared</b> at all.</i>
<b>scary</b>	Frightening; causing fear. <i>It was <b>scary</b> the way they bonded with each other.</i>

<b>scream</b>	Make a loud, high-pitched sound. <i>His supporters <b>scream</b> that he is being done an injustice.</i>
<b>terrify</b>	Fill with terror; frighten greatly. <i>The thought terrifies me.</i>
<b>terrifying</b>	Causing extreme terror. <i>A <b>terrifying</b> wail.</i>
<b>terror</b>	Terrorism. <i>Weapons of <b>terror</b>.</i>
<b>timidity</b>	Fearfulness in venturing into new and unknown places or activities. <i>She believes everyone can overcome their <b>timidity</b>.</i>
<b>timorous</b>	Showing or suffering from nervousness or a lack of confidence. <i>A <b>timorous</b> voice.</i>
