Definitions of "Terrified" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “terrified” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.*



Synonyms of "Terrified" as an adjective (5 Words)

frightened	Afraid or anxious. <i>The frightened child cowered in the corner.</i>
panic-stricken	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.
panic-struck	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation.
panicked	Thrown into a state of intense fear or desperation. <i>Felt panicked before each exam.</i>
panicky	Feeling or characterized by uncontrollable fear or anxiety. <i>Became panicky as the snow deepened.</i>



Usage Examples of "Terrified" as an adjective

- *The terrified horse bolted.*



Associations of "Terrified" (30 Words)

afraid

Filled with regret or concern; used often to soften an unpleasant statement.

*I'm **afraid** I won't be able to come.*

alarming

Frightening because of an awareness of danger.

*Our countryside is disappearing at an **alarming** rate.*

appall

Fill with apprehension or alarm; cause to be unpleasantly surprised.

astounded

Filled with the emotional impact of overwhelming surprise or shock.

***Astounded** viewers wept at the pictures from the Oklahoma City bombing.*

chilling

Provoking fear terror.

*A **chilling** account of the prisoners fate.*

claustrophobia

Extreme or irrational fear of confined places.

*The small stuffy room had begun to give him **claustrophobia**.*

coward	Excessively afraid of danger or pain. <i>They had run away the cowards.</i>
fear	The likelihood of something unwelcome happening. <i>The love and fear of God.</i>
fearfulness	The trait of being afraid.
<u>formidable</u>	Inspiring fear or respect through being impressively large, powerful, intense, or capable. <i>The formidable prospect of major surgery.</i>
fright	Frighten. <i>Ghosts could never affright her.</i>
frighten	Drive out by frightening. <i>At his age I guess he doesn't frighten any more.</i>
frightened	Made afraid. <i>A frightened child.</i>
<u>frightening</u>	Causing fear or dread or terror. <i>A frightening experience.</i>
<u>gaze</u>	A long fixed look. <i>Offices screened from the public gaze.</i>
horrified	Filled with horror; extremely shocked. <i>The horrified spectators.</i>
<u>horror</u>	A thing causing a feeling of horror. <i>Photographs showed the horror of the tragedy.</i>
intimidate	To compel or deter by or as if by threats. <i>The forts are designed to intimidate the nationalist population.</i>
overawe	Subdue, restrain, or overcome by affecting with a feeling of awe; frighten (as with threats). <i>The eleven year old was overawed by the atmosphere.</i>
<u>panic</u>	Drive someone through panic into hasty action. <i>Panic selling.</i>
petrify	Make (someone) so frightened that they are unable to move. <i>Slogans petrify our thinking.</i>
<u>scare</u>	Become scared. <i>I don't think I scare easily.</i>
scared	Made afraid. <i>I wasn't scared at all.</i>
scary	Frightening; causing fear. <i>It was scary the way they bonded with each other.</i>

scream

Make a loud, high-pitched sound.

*His supporters **scream** that he is being done an injustice.*

terrify

Fill with terror; frighten greatly.

The thought terrifies me.

terrifying

Causing extreme terror.

*A **terrifying** wail.*

terror

Terrorism.

*Weapons of **terror**.*

timidity

Fearfulness in venturing into new and unknown places or activities.

*She believes everyone can overcome their **timidity**.*

timorous

Showing or suffering from nervousness or a lack of confidence.

*A **timorous** voice.*
