geographical	Based on or derived from the physical features of an area. <i>The geographical area covered by the Diocese.</i>
<u>local</u>	Of or belonging to or characteristic of a particular locality or neighborhood. <i>Local anesthesia.</i>
localized	Confined or restricted to a particular location. <i>There d now be a more localized news service.</i>
topical	Relating to a particular subject; classified according to subject. <i>A topical reference.</i>

topographical (of a work of art or an artist) dealing with or depicting landscapes or other areas in a realistic and detailed manner.

A **topographical** survey.

zonal

Characterized by or relating to a zone or zones.

Zonal maps.

Associations of "Territorial" (30 Words)

<u>aegis</u>	(in classical art and mythology) an attribute of Zeus and Athene (or their Roman counterparts Jupiter and Minerva) usually represented as a goatskin shield. <i>The negotiations were conducted under the aegis of the UN.</i>
aggressively	In an aggressive manner. <i>Foreign owned banks are aggressively marketing credit cards.</i>
<u>arm</u>	A side part of a chair or other seat on which a sitter can rest their arm. <i>They have extended the arm of friendship to developing countries.</i>
<u>armed</u>	Having arms or arms as specified; used especially in combination. <i>Armed robbery.</i>
armor	Equip with armor.

<u>army</u>	The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare. <i>Army officers.</i>
artillery	A military detachment or branch of the armed forces that uses large-calibre guns. <i>Each corps included two regiments of field artillery.</i>
<u>bow</u>	Play a stringed instrument or music using a bow. <i>The government bowed to the military pressure.</i>
combatant	Someone who fights (or is fighting). <i>A long time combatant for the control of Newcastle FC.</i>
convoy	A group of ships or vehicles travelling together, typically one accompanied by armed troops, warships, or other vehicles for protection. <i>American destroyers helped to convoy much needed supplies to Britain in 1917 18.</i>
cudgel	Beat with a cudgel. <i>They would lie in wait and cudgel her to death.</i>
<u>defend</u>	Conduct the case for (the party being accused or sued) in a lawsuit. <i>He is a lawyer who specializes in defending political prisoners.</i>
defense	An organization of defenders that provides resistance against attack. <i>The artillery battered down the defenses.</i>
defensible	Justifiable by argument. <i>A morally defensible penal system.</i>
fighting	The act of fighting any contest or struggle. <i>There was fighting in the streets.</i>
helmet	A predatory mollusc with a squat heavy shell, which lives in tropical and temperate seas.
inroad	An invasion or hostile attack. <i>The inroads and cross border raiding of the Grahams.</i>
missile	An object which is forcibly propelled at a target, either by hand or from a mechanical weapon. <i>The USAF approach uses small missiles fired from conventional fighter aircraft.</i>
regional	Related or limited to a particular region. <i>Regional and local needs.</i>
<u>reinforcement</u>	An act performed to strengthen approved behavior. <i>A small force would hold the position until reinforcements could be sent.</i>
sectional	Relating to a section or subdivision of a larger whole. <i>Sectional tensions arose over slavery.</i>

sentinel	An indicator of the presence of disease. <i>Soldiers stood sentinel with their muskets.</i>
sentry	A soldier stationed to keep guard or to control access to a place. <i>Two men stood sentry on the door every evening.</i>
<u>shield</u>	A stylized representation of a shield used for displaying a coat of arms. <i>A face shield is sometimes an integral part of a safety helmet.</i>
<u>soldier</u>	Serve as a soldier in the military. <i>Graham wasn't enjoying this but he soldiered on.</i>
<u>sword</u>	One of the suits in a tarot pack. <i>Not many perished by the sword.</i>
tenable	Based on sound reasoning or evidence. <i>Such a simplistic approach is no longer tenable.</i>
<u>war</u>	Make or wage war. <i>The war against crime.</i>
watchman	A member of a body of people employed to keep watch in a town at night. <i>A night watchman.</i>
<u>weapon</u>	Any instrument or instrumentality used in fighting or hunting. <i>He used all his conversational weapons.</i>
