<b>local</b>	Of or belonging to or characteristic of a particular locality or neighborhood. <i><b>Local</b> anesthesia.</i>

<b>topical</b>	Relating to a particular subject; classified according to subject. <i>A <b>topical</b> reference.</i>

<b><u>aegis</u></b>	(in classical art and mythology) an attribute of Zeus and Athene (or their Roman counterparts Jupiter and Minerva) usually represented as a goatskin shield. <i>The negotiations were conducted under the <b>aegis</b> of the UN.</i>
<b>aggressively</b>	In an aggressive manner. <i>Foreign owned banks are <b>aggressively</b> marketing credit cards.</i>
<b><u>arm</u></b>	A side part of a chair or other seat on which a sitter can rest their arm. <i>They have extended the <b>arm</b> of friendship to developing countries.</i>
<b><u>armed</u></b>	Having arms or arms as specified; used especially in combination. <i><b>Armed</b> robbery.</i>
<b>armor</b>	Equip with armor.

<a href="#"><u>army</u></a>	The army of the United States of America the agency that organizes and trains soldiers for land warfare. <i>Army officers.</i>
<b>artillery</b>	A military detachment or branch of the armed forces that uses large-calibre guns. <i>Each corps included two regiments of field <b>artillery</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>bow</u></a>	Play a stringed instrument or music using a bow. <i>The government <b>bowed</b> to the military pressure.</i>
<b>combatant</b>	Someone who fights (or is fighting). <i>A long time <b>combatant</b> for the control of Newcastle FC.</i>
<b>convoy</b>	A group of ships or vehicles travelling together, typically one accompanied by armed troops, warships, or other vehicles for protection. <i>American destroyers helped to <b>convoy</b> much needed supplies to Britain in 1917 18.</i>
<b>cudgel</b>	Beat with a cudgel. <i>They would lie in wait and <b>cudgel</b> her to death.</i>
<a href="#"><u>defend</u></a>	Conduct the case for (the party being accused or sued) in a lawsuit. <i>He is a lawyer who specializes in <b>defending</b> political prisoners.</i>
<b>defense</b>	An organization of defenders that provides resistance against attack. <i>The artillery battered down the <b>defenses</b>.</i>
<b>defensible</b>	Justifiable by argument. <i>A morally <b>defensible</b> penal system.</i>
<b>fighting</b>	The act of fighting any contest or struggle. <i>There was <b>fighting</b> in the streets.</i>
<b>helmet</b>	A predatory mollusc with a squat heavy shell, which lives in tropical and temperate seas.
<b>inroad</b>	An invasion or hostile attack. <i>The <b>inroads</b> and cross border raiding of the Grahams.</i>
<b>missile</b>	An object which is forcibly propelled at a target, either by hand or from a mechanical weapon. <i>The USAF approach uses small <b>missiles</b> fired from conventional fighter aircraft.</i>
<b>regional</b>	Related or limited to a particular region. <i><b>Regional</b> and local needs.</i>
<a href="#"><u>reinforcement</u></a>	An act performed to strengthen approved behavior. <i>A small force would hold the position until <b>reinforcements</b> could be sent.</i>
<b>sectional</b>	Relating to a section or subdivision of a larger whole. <i><b>Sectional</b> tensions arose over slavery.</i>

<b>sentinel</b>	An indicator of the presence of disease. <i>Soldiers stood <b>sentinel</b> with their muskets.</i>
<b>sentry</b>	A soldier stationed to keep guard or to control access to a place. <i>Two men stood <b>sentry</b> on the door every evening.</i>
<u>shield</u>	A stylized representation of a shield used for displaying a coat of arms. <i>A face <b>shield</b> is sometimes an integral part of a safety helmet.</i>
<u>soldier</u>	Serve as a soldier in the military. <i>Graham wasn't enjoying this but he <b>soldiered</b> on.</i>
<u>sword</u>	One of the suits in a tarot pack. <i>Not many perished by the <b>sword</b>.</i>
<b>tenable</b>	Based on sound reasoning or evidence. <i>Such a simplistic approach is no longer <b>tenable</b>.</i>
<u>war</u>	Make or wage war. <i>The <b>war</b> against crime.</i>
<b>watchman</b>	A member of a body of people employed to keep watch in a town at night. <i>A night <b>watchman</b>.</i>
<u>weapon</u>	Any instrument or instrumentality used in fighting or hunting. <i>He used all his conversational <b>weapons</b>.</i>
