- *(especially in the US, Canada, or Australia) an organized division of a country that is not yet admitted to the full rights of a state.*
- *An area defended by a team or player in a game or sport.*
- *Land with a specified characteristic.*
- *An area of knowledge or interest.*

<u><b>district</b></u>	An area of a country or city, especially one characterized by a particular feature or activity. <i>A <b>district</b> health authority.</i>
<b>domain</b>	A particular environment or walk of life. <i>The French <b>domains</b> of the Plantagenets.</i>
<u><b>dominion</b></u>	Sovereignty or control. <i>The Angevin <b>dominions</b>.</i>
<u><b>enclave</b></u>	A place or group that is different in character from those surrounding it. <i>They gave troops a week to leave the coastal <b>enclave</b>.</i>
<u><b>field</b></u>	Fielders collectively or the manner in which they are spread over the pitch. <i>A <b>field</b> of corn.</i>
<b>field of interest</b>	A region in which active military operations are in progress.
<b>ground</b>	Living or growing on or close to the ground. <i>Machines which presoak the coffee <b>grounds</b> produce a superior cup of coffee.</i>
<b>interest</b>	The selfish pursuit of one s own welfare self interest. <i>Holders of voting rights must disclose their <b>interests</b>.</i>
<b>land</b>	The land on which real estate is located. <i>A <b>land</b> of make believe.</i>
<u><b>preserve</b></u>	Fruit preserved by cooking with sugar. <i>Home made <b>preserves</b>.</i>
<u><b>province</b></u>	A territory outside Italy under a Roman governor. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<u><b>realm</b></u>	A domain in which something is dominant. <i>The defence of the <b>realm</b>.</i>
<u><b>region</b></u>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>It was going to take in the <b>region</b> of two or three months to finish the job.</i>
<u><b>section</b></u>	The area created by a plane cutting through a solid. <i>A residential <b>section</b> of the capital.</i>

<b><u>soil</u></b>	<p>The upper layer of earth in which plants grow, a black or dark brown material typically consisting of a mixture of organic remains, clay, and rock particles. <i>Rotary cultivators are ideal particularly on difficult <b>soils</b>.</i></p>
<b><u>speciality</u></b>	<p>A branch of medicine or surgery. <i>His <b>speciality</b> was watercolours.</i></p>
<b>sphere</b>	<p>The apparent surface of the imaginary sphere on which celestial bodies appear to be projected. <i>Political reforms to match those in the economic <b>sphere</b>.</i></p>
<b>sphere of operations</b>	<p>A solid figure bounded by a spherical surface (including the space it encloses.</p>
<b>stamping ground</b>	<p>A small piece of adhesive paper that is put on an object to show that a government tax has been paid.</p>
<b><u>terrain</u></b>	<p>A stretch of land, especially with regard to its physical features. <i>They decided to attack across the rocky <b>terrain</b>.</i></p>
<b>territorial dominion</b>	<p>A territorial military unit.</p>
<b>tract of land</b>	<p>A bundle of myelinated nerve fibers following a path through the brain.</p>
<b>world</b>	<p>Another planet like the earth. <i>The Western <b>world</b>.</i></p>

<b>domain</b>	(mathematics) the set of values of the independent variable for which a function is defined. <i>His <b>domain</b> extended into Europe.</i>
<b>geographic</b>	Determined by geography. <i>The north and south <b>geographic</b> poles.</i>
<b>geographical</b>	Of or relating to the science of geography. <i><b>Geographical</b> research.</i>
<b><u>geography</u></b>	The nature and relative arrangement of places and physical features. <i>The <b>geography</b> of post war London.</i>
<b>inroad</b>	An instance of something being encroached on or reduced by something else. <i>The <b>inroads</b> and cross border raiding of the Grahams.</i>
<b>invasion</b>	Any entry into an area not previously occupied. <i>In 1546 England had to be defended from <b>invasion</b>.</i>
<b><u>kingdom</u></b>	A country, state, or territory ruled by a king or queen. <i>The untroubled <b>kingdom</b> of reason.</i>
<b>municipal</b>	Of or relating to the government of a municipality. <i>International law only authorizes a belligerent to punish a spy under its <b>municipal</b> law.</i>
<b><u>neighborhood</u></b>	An area within a city or town that has some distinctive features (especially one forming a community). <i>An ethnic <b>neighborhood</b>.</i>
<b><u>occupy</u></b>	Occupy the whole of. <i>The young prince will soon <b>occupy</b> the throne.</i>
<b>physiography</b>	The study of physical features of the earth's surface.
<b>prefecture</b>	The office of prefect. <i>Enraged fans besieged the <b>Prefecture</b> of Police.</i>
<b><u>province</u></b>	The proper sphere or extent of your activities. <i>I made my way home to the dreary <b>provinces</b> by train.</i>
<b>quarter</b>	Cut a log into quarters and these into planks so as to show the grain well. <i>The plotters were hanged drawn and <b>quartered</b>.</i>

<b><u>region</u></b>	The approximate amount of something usually used prepositionally as in in the region of. <i>The lumbar <b>region</b>.</i>
<b>regional</b>	Relating to the regions of a country rather than the capital. <i><b>Regional</b> variations.</i>
<b><u>reside</u></b>	(of a quality) be present or inherent in something. <i>The meaning of an utterance does not wholly <b>reside</b> in the semantic meaning.</i>
<b>subdivide</b>	Form into subdivisions. <i>The heading was <b>subdivided</b> into eight separate sections.</i>
<b><u>terrain</u></b>	A stretch of land, especially with regard to its physical features. <i>A mind trying to find its way through difficult theoretical and political <b>terrain</b>.</i>
<b>township</b>	A district six miles square. <i>A Johannesburg <b>township</b>.</i>
<b>unite</b>	Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief. <i>His work <b>unites</b> theory and practice.</i>
<b>welsh</b>	A breed of dual-purpose cattle developed in Wales. <i>Banks began <b>welshing</b> on their agreement not to convert dollar reserves into gold.</i>
<b>zoning</b>	The classification of land according to restrictions placed on its use and development. <i>The property's <b>zoning</b> would allow taller buildings than proposed.</i>
