Definitions of "Terse" as an adjective

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "terse" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Sparing in the use of words; abrupt.
- Brief and to the point; effectively cut short.

Synonyms of "Terse" as an adjective (20 Words)

<u>abrupt</u>	Brief to the point of rudeness; curt. The abrupt double peak.
blunt	Characterized by directness in manner or speech; without subtlety or evasion. The blunt tip of the leaf.
<u>brief</u>	Concise in expression; using few words. Be brief and don t talk for longer than is necessary.
<u>brusque</u>	Marked by rude or peremptory shortness. <i>Try to cultivate a less brusque manner.</i>



<u>clipped</u>	Cut or trimmed by clipping. <i>Close clipped lawns</i> .
<u>compact</u>	Briefly giving the gist of something. <i>Towns</i> compact of wooden houses.
<u>concise</u>	Giving a lot of information clearly and in a few words; brief but comprehensive. A concise explanation.
condensed	Changed from a gas or vapour to a liquid. A condensed version of the report.
crisp	(of paper or cloth) stiff and uncreased. <i>Crisp lettuce</i> .
<u>curt</u>	Marked by rude or peremptory shortness. <i>His reply was curt</i> .
economical	Of or relating to an economy, the system of production and management of material wealth. <i>He was economical</i> in all areas of life.
epigrammatic	In the style of an epigram; concise, clever, and amusing. An epigrammatic style.
gruff	Deep and harsh sounding as if from shouting or illness or emotion- Virgil Thomson. <i>Gruff voices.</i>
incisive	(of an action) quick and direct. <i>Incisive</i> teeth.
laconic	Brief and to the point; effectively cut short. <i>His laconic reply suggested a lack of interest in the topic.</i>
<u>pithy</u>	(of a fruit or plant) containing much pith. <i>His characteristically pithy comments.</i>
short	Of speech sounds or syllables of relatively short duration. <i>The board was a foot short</i> .
short and sweet	Not sufficient to meet a need.
<u>succinct</u>	(especially of something written or spoken) briefly and clearly expressed. <i>Succinct comparisons.</i>
summary	(of a conviction) made by a judge or magistrate without a jury. <i>Summary financial statements.</i>



Usage Examples of "Terse" as an adjective

- Short and terse and easy to understand.
- A terse statement.

Associations of "Terse" (30 Words)

abbreviate	Reduce in scope while retaining essential elements. <i>Network is often abbreviated to net.</i>
abbreviated	Shortened; cut short. An abbreviated version of the earlier work.
abbreviation	The process of abbreviating something. SKU is the abbreviation for Stock Keeping Unit.
<u>brevity</u>	Shortness of time. The staff will edit manuscripts with a view to brevity and clarity.
<u>brief</u>	Instruct a barrister by brief. The reporters were brief ed about the President s plan to invade.
<u>brusque</u>	Abrupt or offhand in speech or manner. She could be brusque and impatient.
<u>clarity</u>	The quality of being easy to see or hear; sharpness of image or sound. For the sake of clarity each of these strategies is dealt with separately.
<u>concise</u>	Expressing much in few words. <i>A</i> <i>concise</i> <i>explanation.</i>
conciseness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<u>curt</u>	Rudely brief. <i>His reply was curt.</i>
drawl	Lengthen and slow down or draw out. A strong Texan drawl .
ephemeral	An ephemeral plant. Fashions are ephemeral new ones regularly drive out the old.
<u>fleeting</u>	Lasting for a markedly brief time. For a fleeting moment I saw the face of a boy.
glance	Throw a glance at take a brief look at. Fish sporting with quick glance Show to the Sun their wav d coats.
interlude	Perform an interlude. The romantic interlude palled rapidly once he was back in town.



laconic	(of a person, speech, or style of writing) using very few words. <i>His laconic</i> reply suggested a lack of interest in the topic.
layover	A brief stay in the course of a journey. There was only a forty eight minute layover .
mortality	The quality or state of being mortal. The work is increasingly haunted by thoughts of mortality .
overview	A general summary of a subject. The report overview s the needs of the community.
pithiness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
<u>pithy</u>	(of a fruit or plant) containing much pith. <i>His characteristically pithy comments.</i>
provisional	A provisional stamp. Provisional bookings.
sententious	Abounding in or given to pompous or aphoristic moralizing. The peculiarly sardonic and sententious style in which Don Luis composed his epigrams.
stopover	A place where a journey is broken. They made a stopover to visit their friends.
<u>succinct</u>	Briefly giving the gist of something. <i>Succinct</i> comparisons.
succinctness	Terseness and economy in writing and speaking achieved by expressing a great deal in just a few words.
transience	The attribute of being brief or fleeting. The transience of life and happiness.
<u>transient</u>	Lasting only for a short time; impermanent. A transient cold spell.
transitory	Lasting a very short time. Love is transitory but it is eternal.
truncate	Replace a corner by a plane. <i>Truncate a series.</i>
