**condensed** Changed from a gas or vapour to a liquid.

A condensed version of the report.

**crisp** (of paper or cloth) stiff and uncreased.

**Crisp** lettuce.

Marked by rude or peremptory shortness.

His reply was **curt**.

Of or relating to an economy, the system of production and management

**economical** of material wealth.

He was **economical** in all areas of life.

In the style of an epigram; concise, clever, and amusing.

epigrammatic An epigrammatic style.

Deep and harsh sounding as if from shouting or illness or emotion- Virgil

**gruff** Thomson.

incisive (of an action) quick and direct.

Incisive teeth.

laconic Brief and to the point; effectively cut short.

pithy (of a fruit or plant) containing much pith.

**short** Of speech sounds or syllables of relatively short duration.

The board was a foot **short**.

**short and sweet** Not sufficient to meet a need.

succinct (especially of something written or spoken) briefly and clearly expressed.

**Succinct** comparisons.

summary (of a conviction) made by a judge or magistrate without a jury.

**Summary** financial statements.
