accredit	Ascribe an achievement to. <i>He was accredited with being one of the world's fastest sprinters.</i>
accuracy	(mathematics) the number of significant figures given in a number. <i>The accuracy of radiocarbon dating.</i>
assurance	A positive declaration intended to give confidence; a promise. <i>She drove with assurance.</i>
assured	Characterized by certainty or security. <i>A tiny but assured income.</i>
<u>authentic</u>	Conforming to fact and therefore worthy of belief. <i>Every detail of the film was totally authentic.</i>
authenticated	Established as genuine.
authorized	Endowed with authority. <i>The authorized biography.</i>

believable	Capable of being believed. <i>She felt that Dawn's story was not quite believable.</i>
certain	Certain to occur destined or inevitable. <i>Felt certain of success.</i>
certified	Fit to be certified as insane and treated accordingly. <i>A certified public accountant.</i>
certitude	Something that someone firmly believes is true. <i>The question may never be answered with certitude.</i>
clinically	In a way that relates to the observation and treatment of actual patients rather than theoretical or laboratory studies. <i>They calmly and clinically documented the ongoing destruction.</i>
convinced	Having a strong belief or conviction. <i>Were convinced that it would be to their advantage to join.</i>
convincing	(of a victory or a winner) leaving no margin of doubt; clear. <i>There is no convincing evidence that advertising influences total alcohol consumption.</i>
credible	Appearing to merit belief or acceptance. <i>A credible threat.</i>
decided	(of a quality) definite; unquestionable. <i>At a distinct or decided disadvantage.</i>
definite	Known for certain. <i>I want a definite answer.</i>
dependable	Worthy of reliance or trust. <i>A dependable supply of cold beer.</i>
documented	Furnished with or supported by documents. <i>The first documented case of shark attack in those waters.</i>
established	Brought about or set up or accepted especially long established. <i>The established social order.</i>
formally	In terms of form or structure. <i>He was formally attired.</i>
indisputable	Not open to question; obviously true. <i>Indisputable evidence of a witness.</i>
proven	(of a new method, system, or treatment) tried and tested. <i>A proven liar.</i>
reliable	A reliable person or thing. <i>Reliable information.</i>

scientifically	With respect to science; in a scientific way. <i>Everything is planned out scientifically.</i>
sure	Definitely or positively sure is sometimes used informally for surely. <i>Sure of her friends.</i>
trust	An arrangement whereby a person a trustee holds property as its nominal owner for the good of one or more beneficiaries. <i>The experience destroyed his trust and personal dignity.</i>
trustworthy	Worthy of trust or belief. <i>An experienced and trustworthy traveling companion.</i>
verifiable	Able to be checked or demonstrated to be true, accurate, or justified. <i>There is not a single verifiable fact.</i>
verified	Proved to be true. <i>A verified claim.</i>
