Definitions of "Testimonial" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “testimonial” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Something that serves as evidence.*
- *A public tribute to someone and to their achievements.*
- *(in sport) a game or event held in honour of a player, who typically receives part of the income generated.*
- *Something that recommends (or expresses commendation of) a person or thing as worthy or desirable.*
- *A formal statement testifying to someone's character and qualifications.*
- *Something given or done as an expression of esteem.*



Synonyms of "Testimonial" as a noun (13 Words)

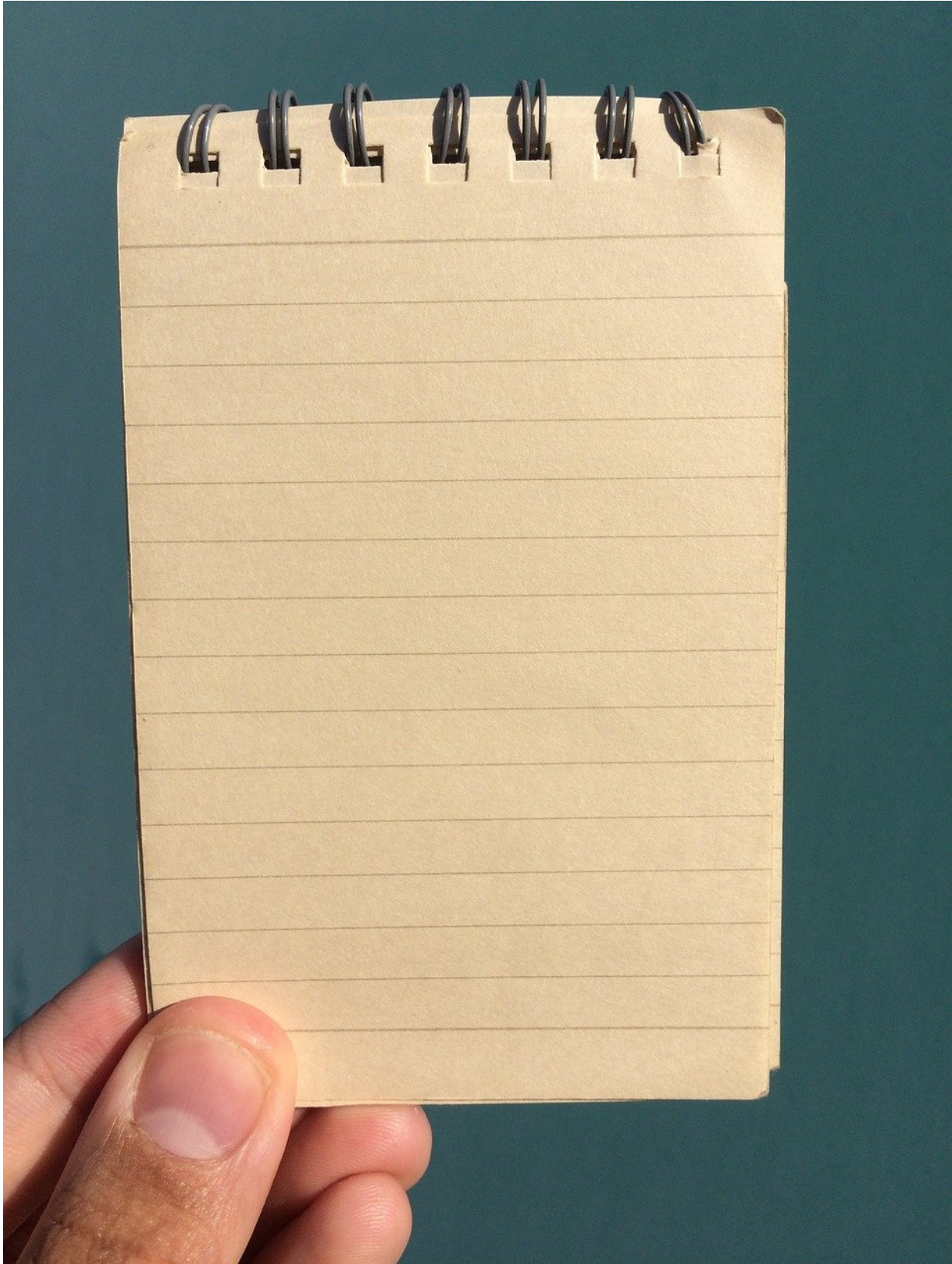
certificate of competence	A document attesting to the truth of certain stated facts.
character reference	A characteristic property that defines the apparent individual nature of something.
commendation	An official award (as for bravery or service) usually given as formal public statement. <i>The book gives commendations for initiative.</i>
endorsement	A speech seconding a motion. <i>A Democrat usually gets the union s endorsement.</i>
gift	Natural abilities or qualities. <i>That goal was an absolute gift.</i>
good word	Moral excellence or admirableness.

letter of recommendation	Owner who lets another person use something (housing usually) for hire.
presentation	A visual representation of something. <i>The Earl of Pembroke offered Herbert the presentation of the living of Bremerton.</i>
recommendation	Any quality or characteristic that gains a person a favorable reception or acceptance or admission. <i>He selected his staff by personal recommendation.</i>
reference	The action of mentioning or alluding to something. <i>Reference to an encyclopedia produced the answer.</i>
<u>testimony</u>	An assertion offering firsthand authentication of a fact. <i>According to his own testimony he can t do it.</i>
tribute	A proportion of ore or its equivalent, paid to a miner for his work, or to the owner or lessor of a mine. <i>A symposium organized to pay tribute to Darwin.</i>
<u>trophy</u>	Something given as a token of victory.

advice	Information; news. <i>Remittance advices.</i>
advise	Inform (someone) about a fact or situation in a formal or official way. <i>Sleeping pills are not advised.</i>
adviser	An expert who gives advice. <i>The military adviser to the President.</i>
advisor	An expert who gives advice. <i>The United States sent military advisors to Guatemala.</i>
apprise	Gain in value. <i>Have the students been apprised of the tuition hike.</i>
communication	The imparting or exchanging of information by speaking, writing, or using some other medium. <i>A city providing excellent road and rail communications.</i>
consultant	A person who provides expert advice professionally. <i>He acted as campaign consultant to the president.</i>
counsel	Give professional help and advice to (someone) to resolve personal or psychological problems. <i>He took much counsel with him.</i>
counseling	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action.
encomium	A speech or piece of writing that praises someone or something highly.
expostulation	An exclamation of protest or remonstrance or reproof.
feedback	Response to an inquiry or experiment. <i>Punk Rock Girl opens the disc with plenty of guitar feedback.</i>
guidance	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>A laser guidance system.</i>
hortative	Giving strong encouragement.
hortatory	Tending or aiming to exhort. <i>A series of hortatory epistles.</i>
letter	An emblem in the shape of the initial letter of a school or university name awarded to a student for achievement in sport. <i>A letter jacket.</i>
monition	A firm rebuke. <i>A letter of admonition about the dangers of immorality.</i>

nomination	A person or thing nominated. <i>Women s groups opposed the nomination of the judge.</i>
offer	Offer verbally. <i>The offer runs right up until Christmas Eve.</i>
paean	A creative work expressing enthusiastic praise. <i>He s created a filmic paean to his hero.</i>
proposal	The act of making a proposal. <i>They listened to her proposal.</i>
<u>propose</u>	Propose or intend. <i>She proposed a new theory of relativity.</i>
<u>proposition</u>	A constitutional proposal; a bill. <i>Securing adequate funding is a time consuming proposition.</i>
<u>reciprocate</u>	Respond to (a gesture or action) by making a corresponding one. <i>The favour was reciprocated.</i>
recommend	Make (someone or something) appealing or desirable. <i>The report recommended that criminal charges be brought.</i>
recommendation	The action of recommending something or someone. <i>He selected his staff by personal recommendation.</i>
<u>submit</u>	Accept or undergo, often unwillingly. <i>He submitted that such measures were justified.</i>
<u>suggest</u>	Suggest the necessity of an intervention in medicine. <i>A simpler explanation suggested itself to me.</i>
suggestion	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>There is no suggestion that he was involved in any wrongdoing.</i>
tribute	Something resulting from a particular quality or feature and indicating its worth. <i>An Abba tribute band.</i>
