## Testimonial as a Noun

### Definitions of "Testimonial" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “testimonial” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *Something that serves as evidence.*
- *A public tribute to someone and to their achievements.*
- *(in sport) a game or event held in honour of a player, who typically receives part of the income generated.*
- *Something that recommends (or expresses commendation of) a person or thing as worthy or desirable.*
- *A formal statement testifying to someone's character and qualifications.*
- *Something given or done as an expression of esteem.*



## Synonyms of "Testimonial" as a noun (13 Words)

<b>certificate of competence</b>	A document attesting to the truth of certain stated facts.
<b>character reference</b>	A characteristic property that defines the apparent individual nature of something.
<b>commendation</b>	An official award (as for bravery or service) usually given as formal public statement. <i>The book gives <b>commendations</b> for initiative.</i>
<b>endorsement</b>	A speech seconding a motion. <i>A Democrat usually gets the union s <b>endorsement</b>.</i>
<b>gift</b>	Natural abilities or qualities. <i>That goal was an absolute <b>gift</b>.</i>
<b>good word</b>	Moral excellence or admirableness.

<b>letter of recommendation</b>	Owner who lets another person use something (housing usually) for hire.
<b>presentation</b>	A visual representation of something. <i>The Earl of Pembroke offered Herbert the <b>presentation</b> of the living of Bremerton.</i>
<b>recommendation</b>	Any quality or characteristic that gains a person a favorable reception or acceptance or admission. <i>He selected his staff by personal <b>recommendation</b>.</i>
<b>reference</b>	The action of mentioning or alluding to something. <i><b>Reference</b> to an encyclopedia produced the answer.</i>
<a href="#"><u>testimony</u></a>	An assertion offering firsthand authentication of a fact. <i>According to his own <b>testimony</b> he can t do it.</i>
<b>tribute</b>	A proportion of ore or its equivalent, paid to a miner for his work, or to the owner or lessor of a mine. <i>A symposium organized to pay <b>tribute</b> to Darwin.</i>
<a href="#"><u>trophy</u></a>	Something given as a token of victory.

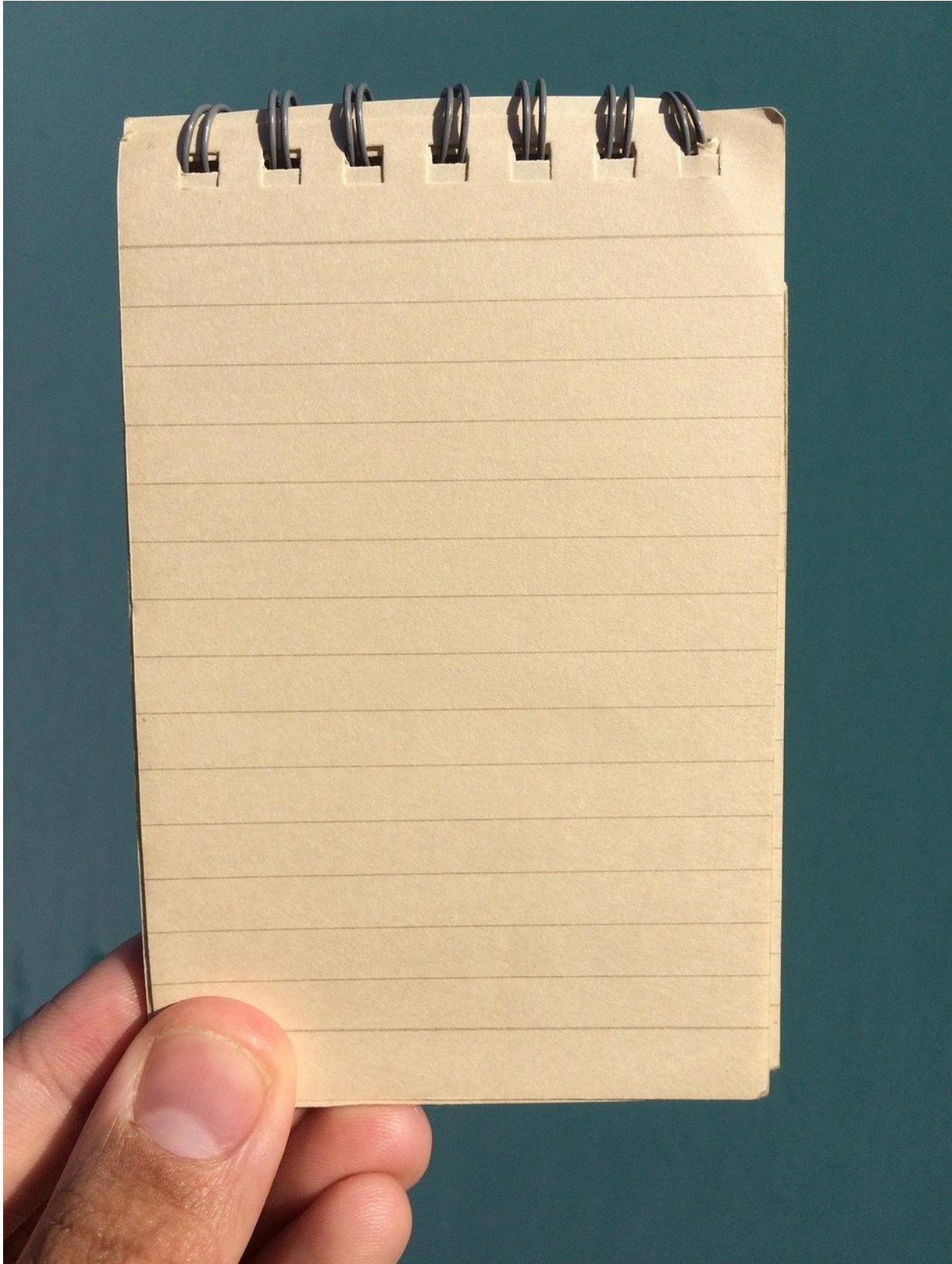




## Usage Examples of "Testimonial" as a noun

## Associations of "Testimonial" (30 Words)

<b>advice</b>	Information; news. <i>Remittance <b>advices</b>.</i>
<b>advise</b>	Inform (someone) about a fact or situation in a formal or official way. <i>Sleeping pills are not <b>advised</b>.</i>
<b>adviser</b>	An expert who gives advice. <i>The military <b>adviser</b> to the President.</i>
<b>advisor</b>	An expert who gives advice. <i>The United States sent military <b>advisors</b> to Guatemala.</i>
<b>apprise</b>	Gain in value. <i>Have the students been <b>apprised</b> of the tuition hike.</i>
<b>communication</b>	The imparting or exchanging of information by speaking, writing, or using some other medium. <i>A city providing excellent road and rail <b>communications</b>.</i>
<b>consultant</b>	A person who provides expert advice professionally. <i>He acted as campaign <b>consultant</b> to the president.</i>
<b>counsel</b>	Give professional help and advice to (someone) to resolve personal or psychological problems. <i>He took much <b>counsel</b> with him.</i>
<b>counseling</b>	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action.
<b>encomium</b>	A speech or piece of writing that praises someone or something highly.
<b>expostulation</b>	An exclamation of protest or remonstrance or reproof.
<b>feedback</b>	Response to an inquiry or experiment. <i>Punk Rock Girl opens the disc with plenty of guitar <b>feedback</b>.</i>
<b>guidance</b>	Something that provides direction or advice as to a decision or course of action. <i>A laser <b>guidance</b> system.</i>
<b>hortative</b>	Giving strong encouragement.
<b>hortatory</b>	Tending or aiming to exhort. <i>A series of <b>hortatory</b> epistles.</i>
<b>letter</b>	An emblem in the shape of the initial letter of a school or university name awarded to a student for achievement in sport. <i>A <b>letter</b> jacket.</i>
<b>monition</b>	A firm rebuke. <i>A letter of <b>admonition</b> about the dangers of immorality.</i>

<b>nomination</b>	A person or thing nominated. <i>Women s groups opposed the <b>nomination</b> of the judge.</i>
<b>offer</b>	Offer verbally. <i>The <b>offer</b> runs right up until Christmas Eve.</i>
<b>paean</b>	A creative work expressing enthusiastic praise. <i>He s created a filmic <b>paean</b> to his hero.</i>
<b>proposal</b>	The act of making a proposal. <i>They listened to her <b>proposal</b>.</i>
<b><u>propose</u></b>	Propose or intend. <i>She <b>proposed</b> a new theory of relativity.</i>
<b><u>proposition</u></b>	A constitutional proposal; a bill. <i>Securing adequate funding is a time consuming <b>proposition</b>.</i>
<b><u>reciprocate</u></b>	Respond to (a gesture or action) by making a corresponding one. <i>The favour was <b>reciprocated</b>.</i>
<b>recommend</b>	Make (someone or something) appealing or desirable. <i>The report <b>recommended</b> that criminal charges be brought.</i>
<b>recommendation</b>	The action of recommending something or someone. <i>He selected his staff by personal <b>recommendation</b>.</i>
<b><u>submit</u></b>	Accept or undergo, often unwillingly. <i>He <b>submitted</b> that such measures were justified.</i>
<b><u>suggest</u></b>	Suggest the necessity of an intervention in medicine. <i>A simpler explanation <b>suggested</b> itself to me.</i>
<b>suggestion</b>	Persuasion formulated as a suggestion. <i>There is no <b>suggestion</b> that he was involved in any wrongdoing.</i>
<b>tribute</b>	Something resulting from a particular quality or feature and indicating its worth. <i>An Abba <b>tribute</b> band.</i>
