A measure of length equivalent to a chain 66 ft.

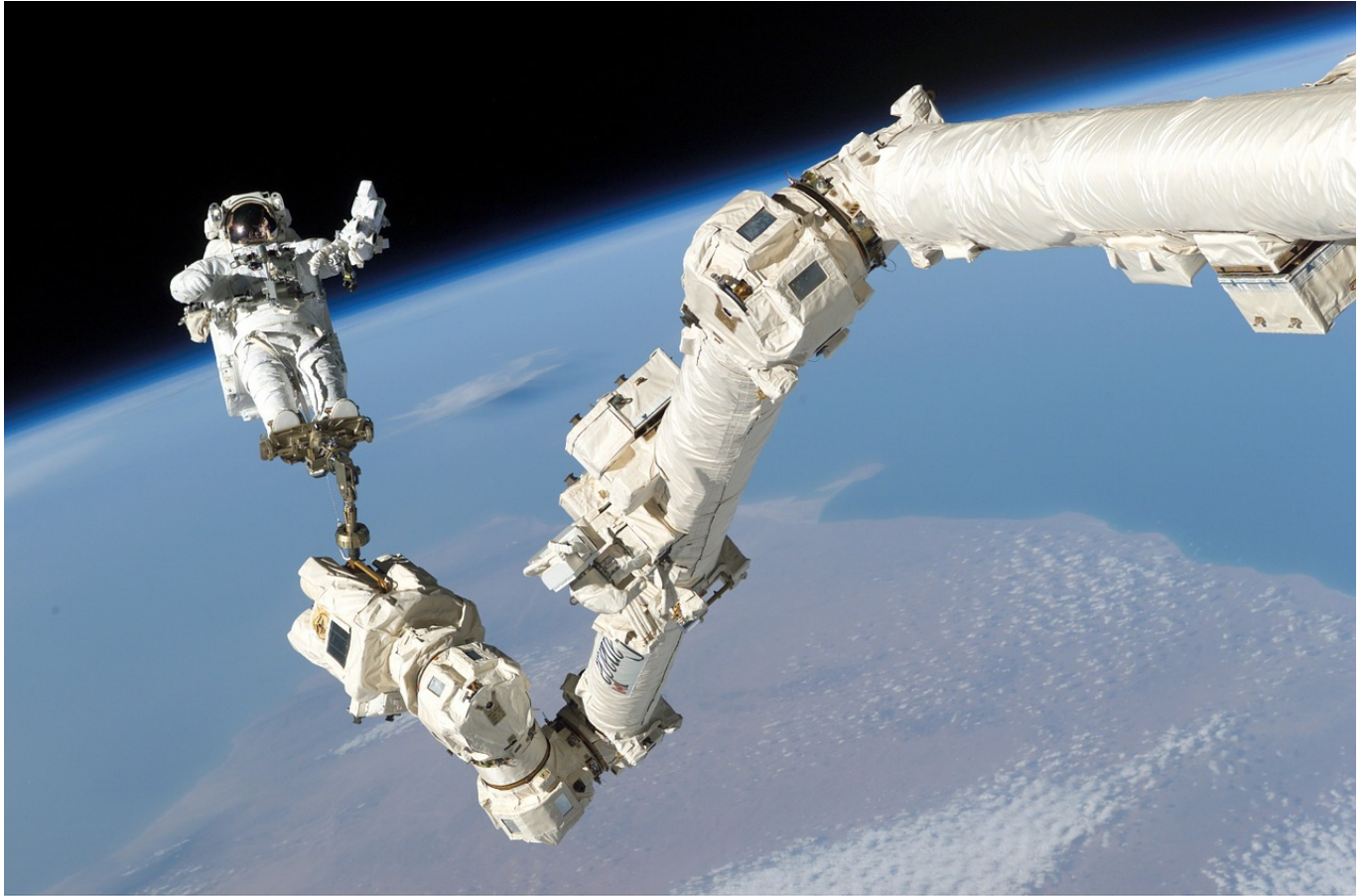
*A tall man with a heavy gold **chain** round his neck.*

- cord** A length of cord.  
*She began toying with the telephone **cord**.*
- lead** A position of being the initiator of something and an example that others will follow especially in the phrase take the lead.  
*A **lead** guitarist.*
- leash** Restraint consisting of a rope (or light chain) used to restrain an animal.  
*Kept a tight **leash** on his emotions.*
- rope** The ropes enclosing a boxing or wrestling ring.  
*There was no way down even with a **rope**.*

### Definitions of "Tether" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "tether" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Tie with a tether.*
- *Use (a smartphone) in order to connect a computer or other device to the internet.*
- *Tie (an animal) with a rope or chain so as to restrict its movement.*





## Synonyms of "Tether" as a verb (5 Words)

**chain** Confine with a chain.  
*As an actuary you will not be **chained** to a desk.*

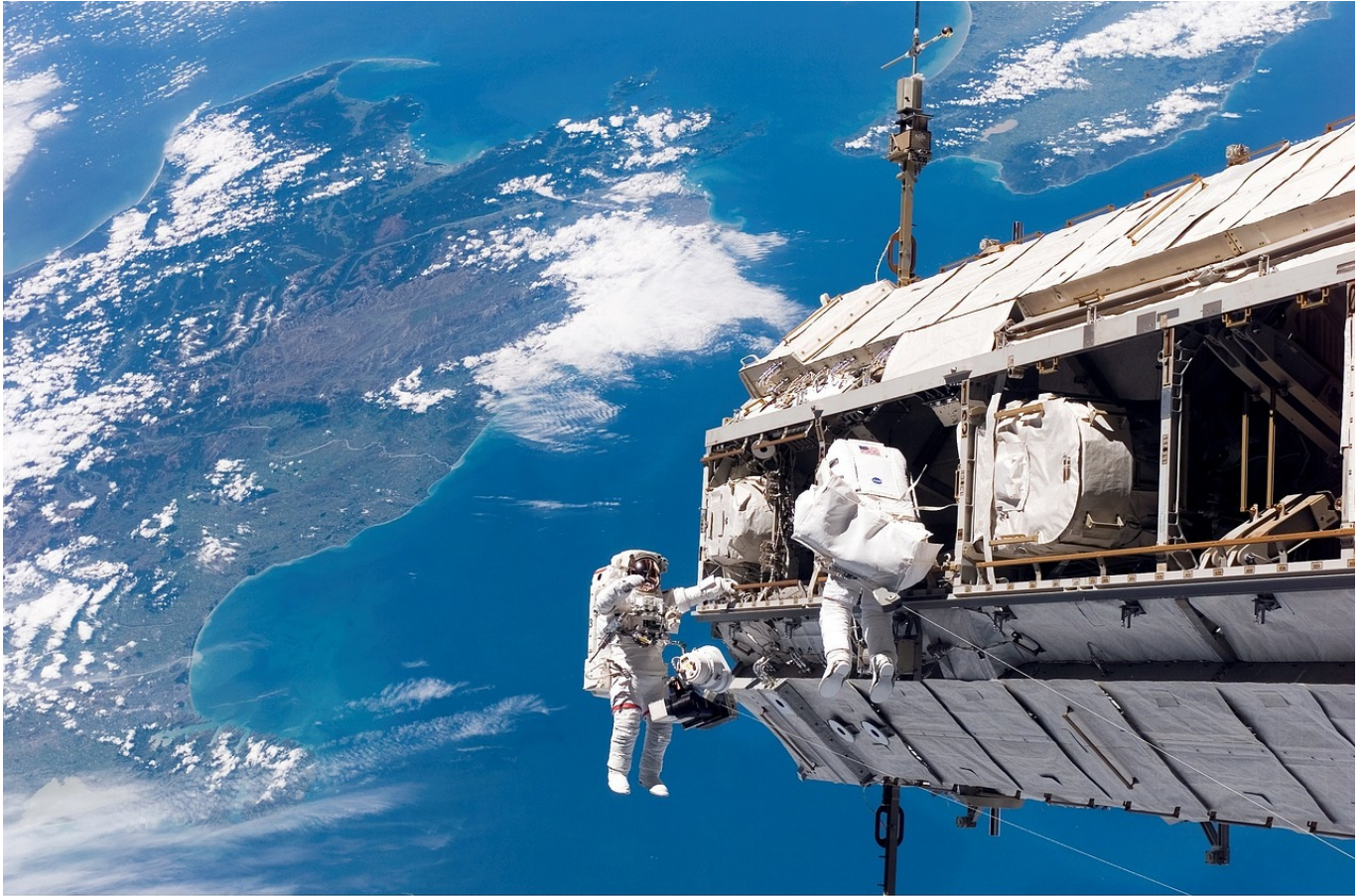
**hitch** Travel by hitch hiking.  
***Hitch** the trailer to the car.*

**rope** Catch fasten or secure with rope.  
***Rope** the bag securely.*

**tie** Create social or emotional ties.  
*Her long hair was **tied** back in a bow.*

**tie up** Create social or emotional ties.

## Usage Examples of "Tether" as a verb

- *Check if Wi-Fi access is free in the lobby or tether your phone.*
- *Tether horses.*
- *The horse had been tethered to a post.*



## Associations of "Tether" (30 Words)

### breadth

A piece of cloth of standard or full width.

*A teacher must have a **breadth** of knowledge of the subject.*

### chain

Fasten or secure with a chain.

*Our offer was accepted this morning and there s no **chain**.*

### **concatenate**

Combine two strings to form a single one.

*Some words may be **concatenated** such that certain sounds are omitted.*

### **concatenation**

The state of being linked together as in a chain; union in a linked series.

*The **concatenation** of lists.*

### **cord**

A cordlike rib on fabric.

*The cloth for their suits was **cord**.*



<b>four</b>	A playing card or domino or die whose upward face shows four pips.
<b>hawser</b>	A thick rope or cable for mooring or towing a ship.
<b>leash</b>	Put a leash on a dog. <i>He called Azor to heel so that he could <b>leash</b> him.</i>
<b>numeral</b>	A figure, symbol, or group of figures or symbols denoting a number. A <b>numeral</b> adjective.
<b><u>orbit</u></b>	The state of moving in an orbit. <i>The moon <b>orbits</b> around the Earth.</i>
<b>pirouette</b>	Do a pirouette usually as part of a dance. <i>She <b>pirouetted</b> and made a bow.</i>
<b>quadruple</b>	A quadruple number or amount. <b>Quadruple</b> rhythm has four beats per measure.
<b>range</b>	Place or arrange in a row or rows or in a specified manner. <b>Range</b> the animals in the prairie.
<b>rope</b>	The ropes enclosing a boxing or wrestling ring. <i>Executions by the <b>rope</b> continued well into the twentieth century.</i>
<b>satellite</b>	Satellite television. <i>The Soviet Union and its <b>satellite</b> states.</i>
<b><u>scope</u></b>	A telescope microscope or other device having a name ending in scope. <i>The <b>scope</b> for major change is always limited by political realities.</i>
<b>six</b>	Denoting a quantity consisting of six items or units.
<b><u>strand</u></b>	Leave stranded or isolated with little hope of rescue. <i>A heron glided to rest on a pebbly <b>strand</b>.</i>
<b><u>string</u></b>	Provide with strings. <b>String</b> my guitar.
<b>ternary</b>	Having three units or components or elements. A <b>ternary</b> operation.
<b><u>tertiary</u></b>	Relating to or denoting education at a level beyond that provided by schools, especially that provided by a college or university. <i>Patients in <b>tertiary</b> care.</i>
<b><u>three</u></b>	One of four playing cards in a deck having three pips.
<b><u>triad</u></b>	Three people considered as a unit. <i>The <b>triad</b> of medication diet and exercise are necessary in diabetes care.</i>
<b>tricycle</b>	Ride on a tricycle. <i>A small boy <b>tricycled</b> to the end of his driveway.</i>
<b><u>trilogy</u></b>	A group of three related novels, plays, films, etc. <i>A <b>trilogy</b> of cases reflected this development.</i>

**trinity**

The cardinal number that is the sum of one and one and one.  
*God is said to be **trinity** in unity.*

**trio**

The central, typically contrastive, section of a minuet, scherzo, or march.  
*A jazz **trio**.*

**triple**

Hit a triple.  
*A **triple** dark rum.*

**triptych**

Art consisting of a painting or carving (especially an altarpiece) on three panels (usually hinged together).  
*A **triptych** depicting the Crucifixion.*

**twine**

Make by twisting together or intertwining.  
***Twine** a rope.*
