

Definitions of "Tether" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "tether" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- Tie with a tether.
- Use (a smartphone) in order to connect a computer or other device to the internet.
- Tie (an animal) with a rope or chain so as to restrict its movement.
