## **Textile as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Textile" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “textile” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A type of cloth or woven fabric.*
- *Artifact made by weaving or felting or knitting or crocheting natural or synthetic fibers.*
- *The branch of industry involved in the manufacture of cloth.*
- *Used by nudists to describe someone wearing clothes, especially on a beach.*



### Synonyms of "Textile" as a noun (3 Words)

- cloth** A piece of cloth for cleaning or covering something e g a dishcloth or a tablecloth.  
*Wipe clean with a damp **cloth**.*
- fabric** The walls, floor, and roof of a building.  
*The multicultural **fabric** of Canadian society.*
- material** Cloth or fabric.  
*Cleaning **materials**.*



## Usage Examples of "Textile" as a noun

- *Nudists to the left, textiles to the right.*
- *In textiles, more women were employed than men.*
- *A fascinating range of pottery, jewellery, and textiles.*



## Associations of "Textile" (30 Words)

- adipose** (especially of body tissue) used for the storage of fat.  
***Adipose** tissue constitutes the fat of meat.*
- baize** A bright green fabric napped to resemble felt; used to cover gaming tables.
- canvas** A large piece of fabric usually canvas fabric by means of which wind is used to propel a sailing vessel.  
*The door had been **canvassed** over.*
- cloth** A piece of cloth for cleaning or covering something e.g a dishcloth or a tablecloth.  
*Woven **cloth** originated in Mesopotamia around 5000 BC.*
- cotton** Cotton wool.  
*A cargo of **cotton** and wheat.*
- doff** Take off or raise (one's hat) as a greeting or token of respect.  
*The manager **doffed** his hat to her.*

<b>drape</b>	The manner in which fabric hangs or falls. <i>Drape the statue with a sheet.</i>
<b>drapery</b>	The depiction of folds of cloth in sculpture or painting. <i>The hall of the school was hung with green <b>drapery</b>.</i>
<b>fabric</b>	The underlying structure. <i>It is part of the <b>fabric</b> of society.</i>
<b>felt</b>	Cover with felt. <i>The fibres are shredded and <b>felted</b> together.</i>
<b>filling</b>	The act of filling something. <i>A gold <b>filling</b>.</i>
<b>freon</b>	Any one or more chlorofluorocarbons (or related compounds) that are used as an aerosol propellant, organic solvent, or refrigerant.
<b>hank</b>	A measurement of the length per unit mass of cloth or yarn, which varies according to the type being measured. For example it is equal to 840 yards for cotton yarn and 560 yards for worsted. <i>A thick <b>hank</b> of her blonde hair.</i>
<b>interweave</b>	Interlace by or as if by weaving. <i>The rugs are made by tightly interweaving the strands.</i>
<b>lined</b>	(used especially of skin) marked by lines or seams. <i>He had kind eyes and a deeply <b>lined</b> face.</i>
<b>linen</b>	Articles such as sheets or clothes made or originally made of linen. <i>He dealt in Irish <b>linens</b>.</i>
<b>lining</b>	The act of attaching an inside lining to a garment or curtain etc. <i>Leather gloves with fur <b>linings</b>.</i>
<b>loincloth</b>	A garment that provides covering for the loins.
<b>material</b>	Having material or physical form or substance Benjamin Jowett. <i>Useful teaching <b>materials</b>.</i>
<b>plush</b>	Richly luxurious and expensive. <i>A <b>plush</b> Mayfair flat.</i>
<b>qualitatively</b>	With regard to the quality or qualities of something rather than its quantity. <i>Our results differ <b>qualitatively</b> from previous studies.</i>
<b>silk</b>	Animal fibers produced by silkworms and other larvae that spin cocoons and by most spiders. <i>A frock of pale blue <b>silk</b>.</i>
<b>stratum</b>	A foundation or basis of something. <i>There is a broad <b>stratum</b> of truth in her story.</i>

- thread** Pluck hairs from the eyebrows or another part of the body using a twisted cotton thread.  
*She had her eyebrows **threaded**.*
- upholstery** The art or practice of upholstering furniture.  
*Leather **upholstery**.*
- valance** A length of decorative drapery hung above a window to screen the curtain fittings.
- vinyl** Vinyl used as the standard material for records.  
*The **vinyl** is cut to size with a craft knife.*
- weft** The yarn woven across the warp yarn in weaving.  
***Weft** threads.*
- wool** Yarn or textile fibre made from wool.  
*Lead **wool**.*
- yarn** Tell or spin a yarn.  
*A fine **yarn** for a lightweight garment.*
