Definitions of "Texts" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "texts" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- A passage from the Bible that is used as the subject of a sermon.
- The main body of a written work (as distinct from illustrations or footnotes etc.
- A book prepared for use in schools or colleges.
- The words of something written.

alphabet

Read with difficulty.

Visual signals help us **decipher** what is being communicated.

dictation Matter that has been dictated and transcribed; a dictated passage.

The **dictation** of letters.

document Support or accompany with documentation.

Can you **document** your claims.

dramaturgy The theory and practice of dramatic composition.

Studies of Shakespeare s **dramaturgy**.

hieroglyphic Writing that resembles hieroglyphics usually by being illegible.

Notebooks filled with illegible **hieroglyphics**.

A space left by indenting text.

indentation A concave cut into a surface or edge (as in a coastline.

An indentation for each change of speaker.

inscription Letters inscribed (especially words engraved or carved) on something.

The **inscription** on her headstone.

lexicographer | A compiler or writer of a dictionary; a student of the lexical component of

language.

linguisticRelating to language or linguistics.

A child s **linguistic** ability.

notation A note or annotation.

Algebraic **notation**.

A manuscript or piece of writing material on which later writing has been

palimpsest superimposed on effaced earlier writing.

paragraphWrite paragraphs work as a paragrapher.
