## Associations of "Thanked" (30 Words)

<b><u>admiration</u></b>	Pleasurable contemplation. <i>A small token in <b>admiration</b> of your works.</i>
<b>appreciate</b>	Understand (a situation) fully; grasp the full implications of. <i>The Germans want to <b>appreciate</b> the Deutsche Mark.</i>
<b>appreciated</b>	Fully understood or grasped. <i>Dangers not yet <b>appreciated</b>.</i>
<b>appreciation</b>	Increase in monetary value. <i>He expressed his <b>appreciation</b> in a short note.</i>
<b>appreciative</b>	Feeling or showing gratitude or pleasure. <i>The team are very <b>appreciative</b> of your support.</i>
<b><u>beholden</u></b>	Owing thanks or having a duty to someone in return for help or a service. <i>I don't like to be <b>beholden</b> to anybody.</i>
<b>beneficence</b>	The quality of being kind or helpful or generous.
<b><u>beneficiary</u></b>	A person who derives advantage from something, especially a trust, will, or life insurance policy.
<b>debtor</b>	A person who owes a creditor; someone who has the obligation of paying a debt. <i>Generally <b>debtors</b> must negotiate with each creditor separately.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Filled with wonder and delight. <i>We were <b>delighted</b> to see her.</i>
<b>donate</b>	Give to a charity or good cause. <i>She <b>donates</b> to her favorite charity every month.</i>
<b>endowment</b>	A form of life insurance involving payment of a fixed sum to the insured person on a specified date, or to their estate should they die before this date. <i>University <b>endowments</b>.</i>

<b>feel</b>	Grope or feel in search of something. <i>I made the students <b>feel</b> different about themselves.</i>
<b><u>generosity</u></b>	The quality of being kind and generous. <i>I was overwhelmed by the <b>generosity</b> of friends and neighbours.</i>
<b>generously</b>	In a way that shows a readiness to give more of something, especially money, than is necessary or expected. <i>Food is shared <b>generously</b>.</i>
<b>gift</b>	Give as a present make a gift of. <i>His mother s <b>gift</b> of a pen.</i>
<b>giver</b>	Someone who devotes himself completely. <i>There are no greater <b>givers</b> than those who give themselves.</i>
<b>grateful</b>	Feeling or showing an appreciation for something done or received. <i><b>Grateful</b> for the tree s shade.</i>
<b>gratitude</b>	The quality of being thankful; readiness to show appreciation for and to return kindness. <i>He was overwhelmed with <b>gratitude</b> for their help.</i>
<b><u>indebted</u></b>	Owing gratitude or recognition to another for help or favors etc. <i>I am <b>indebted</b> to her for her help in indexing my book.</i>
<b>largess</b>	Liberality in bestowing gifts; extremely liberal and generous of spirit.
<b>magnanimity</b>	The fact or condition of being magnanimous; generosity. <i>Both sides will have to show <b>magnanimity</b>.</i>
<b><u>obligated</u></b>	Caused by law or conscience to follow a certain course. <i>Was <b>obligated</b> to pay off the student loan.</i>
<b><u>pleased</u></b>	Experiencing or manifesting pleasure. <i>Both girls were <b>pleased</b> with their new hairstyles.</i>
<b>relieved</b>	Made easier to bear. <i><b>Relieved</b> parents who had waited anxiously for news.</i>
<b><u>tasteful</u></b>	Having or showing or conforming to good taste. <i>A <b>tasteful</b> lounge bar.</i>
<b><u>thankful</u></b>	Expressing gratitude and relief. <i>I was very <b>thankful</b> to be alive.</i>
<b>thanks</b>	An expression of gratitude. <i><b>Thanks</b> to hard work it was a great success.</i>
<b><u>tolerant</u></b>	Tolerant and forgiving under provocation. <i>Fault <b>tolerant</b> computer systems.</i>
