### Definitions of "Thankfully" as an adverb

- *Used to express pleasure or relief at a fortunate outcome.*
- *In a thankful manner; with thanks.*
- *Let us be thankful that.*

### Synonyms of "Thankfully" as an adverb (8 Words)

**as luck would have it** To the same degree (often followed by `as.

**by good fortune** So as to pass a given point.

**by good luck** In reserve; not for immediate use.

**fortunately** By good fortune.

***Fortunately*** *no shots were fired and no one was hurt.*

**gratefully** With appreciation for something done or received.  
*They smiled **gratefully** at her understanding.*

**[happily](#)** In an unexpectedly lucky way.  
*They shouted **happily**.*

<b>propitiously</b>	In an auspicious manner.
<b>providentially</b>	In a prudent manner.

## Usage Examples of "Thankfully" as an adverb

- *She thankfully accepted the armchair she was offered.*
- *He accepted thankfully my apologies.*
- *Thankfully, everything went smoothly.*

## Associations of "Thankfully" (30 Words)

<b>accept</b>	Make use of or accept for some purpose. <i>Credit cards are widely <b>accepted</b>.</i>
<b>accepting</b>	Tolerating without protest. <i>Always more <b>accepting</b> of coaching suggestion than her teammates.</i>
<b>acknowledge</b>	Express recognition of the presence or existence of, or acquaintance with. <i>Henry <b>acknowledged</b> Richard as his heir.</i>
<b>acknowledgement</b>	The action of showing that one has noticed someone or something. <i>He touched his hat in <b>acknowledgement</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>admit</u></a>	Admit into a group or community. <i>This pipe <b>admits</b> air.</i>
<b>admittedly</b>	Used to express a concession or recognition that something is the case. <i><b>Admittedly</b> the salary was not wonderful.</i>
<b>apologize</b>	Defend, explain, clear away, or make excuses for by reasoning. <i>I <b>apologized</b> for being late.</i>
<b>appreciatively</b>	With appreciation; in a grateful manner. <i>He accepted my offer <b>appreciatively</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>cognition</u></a>	A perception sensation idea or intuition resulting from the process of cognition.
<b>cognizant</b>	Having knowledge or awareness. <i>Statesmen must be <b>cognizant</b> of the political boundaries within which they work.</i>
<a href="#"><u>concede</u></a>	Be willing to concede. <i>The candidate <b>conceded</b> after enough votes had come in to show that he would lose.</i>

<b>confess</b>	Confess to God in the presence of a priest as in the Catholic faith. <i>St Ambrose would weep bitter tears when <b>confessing</b> a sinner.</i>
<b><u>confide</u></b>	Reveal in private tell confidentially. <i>The property of others <b>confided</b> to their care was unjustifiably risked.</i>
<b>fallibility</b>	The likelihood of making errors. <i>Studies on the <b>fallibility</b> of memory and perception.</i>
<b>fortunately</b>	By good fortune. <i><b>Fortunately</b> no shots were fired and no one was hurt.</i>
<b>grant</b>	The action of granting something. <i>They will <b>grant</b> you asylum.</i>
<b>gratefully</b>	With appreciation; in a grateful manner. <i>They smiled <b>gratefully</b> at her understanding.</i>
<b><u>greet</u></b>	Send greetings to. <i>Everyone <b>greeted</b> this idea warmly.</i>
<b><u>happily</u></b>	In a happy way. <i>They shouted <b>happily</b>.</i>
<b><u>honorable</u></b>	Adhering to ethical and moral principles. <i>Followed the only <b>honorable</b> course of action.</i>
<b><u>luckily</u></b>	It is fortunate that. <i><b>Luckily</b> they didn't recognize me.</i>
<b>penance</b>	Impose a penance on. <i>He had done public <b>penance</b> for those hasty words.</i>
<b>profess</b>	Practice as a profession teach or claim to be knowledgeable about. <i>A people <b>professing</b> Christianity.</i>
<b>realization</b>	An act of becoming fully aware of something as a fact. <i>A growing <b>realization</b> of the need to create common economic structures.</i>
<b>receive</b>	Receive a specified treatment abstract. <i>The impression she <b>received</b> was one of unhurried leisure.</i>
<b>receptiveness</b>	Willingness or readiness to receive (especially impressions or ideas). <i>This <b>receptiveness</b> is the key feature in oestral behavior enabling natural mating to occur.</i>
<b>recognize</b>	Accept (someone) to be what is claimed or accept his power and authority. <i>My work is not <b>recognized</b> by anybody.</i>
<b>recognized</b>	Provided with a secure reputation. <i>A <b>recognized</b> authority.</i>

In a hopeless resigned manner.

**retrospect**

A survey or review of a past course of events or period of time.
