<b><a href="#">affirm</a></b>	To declare or affirm solemnly and formally as true. <i>The Court of Appeal <b>affirmed</b> a decision of the High Court.</i>
<b>again</b>	In addition to what has already been mentioned. <i>It was great to meet old friends <b>again</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">aver</a></b>	Allege as a fact in support of a plea. <i>I don't have to do anything it's his problem he <b>averred</b>.</i>
<b>avow</b>	Assert or confess openly. <i>He <b>avowed</b> that he had voted Labour in every election.</i>
<b>constantly</b>	Continuously over a period of time; always. <i>He was <b>constantly</b> on her mind.</i>
<b>continue</b>	Continue talking. <i>I told him he was obstructing the enquiry and he let me <b>continue</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">deny</a></b>	Deny formally an allegation of fact by the opposing party in a legal suit. <i>There was no way that I was going to <b>deny</b> myself ice cream.</i>
<b><a href="#">echo</a></b>	Ring or echo with sound. <i>She could hear <b>echoes</b> of her own footsteps.</i>
<b>habit</b>	Put a habit on. <i>In the vile <b>habit</b> of a village slave.</i>
<b>habitually</b>	By way of habit; customarily. <i>Does he lie <b>habitually</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">hobby</a></b>	An auxiliary activity. <i>Her hobbies are reading and gardening.</i>
<b>iterate</b>	Perform or utter repeatedly. <i>The function <b>iterates</b>.</i>
<b>justly</b>	With honesty. <i>We can <b>justly</b> be proud of our achievements.</i>
<b>oh</b>	A midwestern state in north central United States in the Great Lakes region.

<b>outlast</b>	Live longer than. <i>The kind of beauty that will <b>outlast</b> youth.</i>
<b>paraphrase</b>	Express the meaning of (something written or spoken) using different words, especially to achieve greater clarity. <i>You can either quote or <b>paraphrase</b> literary texts.</i>
<b>pummel</b>	Criticize severely. <i>The pedestrians <b>pummeled</b> the demonstrators.</i>
<b>recapitulate</b>	Repeat (an evolutionary or other process) during development and growth. <i>Let s <b>recapitulate</b> the main ideas.</i>
<b>reiterate</b>	To say, state, or perform again. <i>She <b>reiterated</b> that the government would remain steadfast in its support.</i>
<b>repeat</b>	A decorative pattern which is repeated uniformly over a surface. <i>That cucumber <b>repeated</b> on me for hours.</i>
<b>repeatedly</b>	Several time. <i>They have been warned <b>repeatedly</b> with no effect.</i>
<b>repetition</b>	The repeated use of the same word or word pattern as a rhetorical device. <i>I didn t want a <b>repetition</b> of the scene in my office that morning.</i>
<b>reprise</b>	Repeat (a piece of music or a performance). <i>He <b>reprises</b> his role as the vigilante architect.</i>
<b>restate</b>	State (something) again or differently, especially more clearly or convincingly. <i>He <b>restated</b> his opposition to abortion.</i>
<b>review</b>	Hold a review of troops. <i>All slides were then <b>reviewed</b> by one pathologist.</i>
<b>silently</b>	Without making any sound. <i>She sobbed <b>silently</b> in the corner.</i>
<b>speak</b>	Use language. <i>Insufficient air circulates for the pipes to <b>speak</b>.</i>
<b>talk</b>	The act of giving a talk to an audience. <i>It was no use <b>talking</b> to Anthony.</i>
<b>warn</b>	Ask to go away. <i>I <b>warned</b> you that I would ask some difficult questions.</i>
<b>wow</b>	Impress greatly. <i>Your play s a <b>wow</b>.</i>
