histrionic Excessively theatrical or dramatic in character or style.

Histrionic gestures.

impresario A person who organizes and often finances concerts, plays, or operas.

An interest group that tries to influence legislators or bureaucrats to act in

<u>lobby</u> their favor typically through lobbying.

Members of the anti abortion **lobby**.

minstrel A performer in a minstrel show.

The exaggerated dialect of blackface **minstrels**.

movie A cinema film.

They went to a **movie** every Saturday night.

Someone who plays a musical instrument (as a profession.

musicianYour father was a fine **musician**.

nickelodeon A cinema with an admission fee of one nickel.

novelist One who writes novels.

performer An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience.

A circus **performer**.

playwright Someone who writes plays.

preview A facility for inspecting the appearance of a document before it is printed.

The company will **preview** an enhanced version of its database.

A small figure of a person operated from above with strings by a puppeteer.

A puppet show.

Fabric of metal or plastic mesh.

The less than successful **screening** of the sitcom s pilot episode.

Perform a stunt or stunts.

Some weeds produce chemicals that **stunt** the plant s growth.
