<b>dramaturgy</b>	The art of writing and producing plays. <i>Studies of Shakespeare s <b>dramaturgy</b>.</i>
<b>field</b>	A fielder. <i>Anthropologists do much of their work in the <b>field</b>.</i>
<b>field of operations</b>	A region where a battle is being (or has been) fought.
<b>house</b>	The management of a gambling house or casino. <i>The sixty member National Council the country s upper <b>house</b>.</i>
<b>theater of operations</b>	A region in which active military operations are in progress.
<b>theatre</b>	An operating theatre. <i>This is intense moving and inspiring <b>theatre</b>.</i>

**theatre of operations** A process or series of acts especially of a practical or mechanical nature involved in a particular form of work.



### Usage Examples of "Theater" as a noun

- *He served in the Vietnam theater for three years.*



## Associations of "Theater" (30 Words)

- acting** Serving temporarily especially as a substitute.  
*She studied **acting** in New York.*
- actor** A person whose profession is acting on the stage, in films, or on television.  
*In war one must be a good **actor**.*
- anteroom** A large room in an officers' mess, typically adjacent to the dining room.
- cinematic** Relating to the cinema.  
***Cinematic** output.*
- comedian** An entertainer on stage or television whose act is designed to make an audience laugh.  
*He s a real **comedian** this fellow.*
- comic** A professional performer who tells jokes and performs comical acts.  
*A **comic** monologue.*

<b>composer</b>	Someone who composes music as a profession. <i>Mozart was her favourite <b>composer</b>.</i>
<b>doll</b>	Informal terms for a (young) woman. <i>I got all <b>dolled</b> up for a party.</i>
<b>dramatist</b>	A person who writes plays.
<b>entertainer</b>	A person who tries to please or amuse. <i>Street <b>entertainers</b>.</i>
<b>film</b>	Be well or badly suited to portrayal in a film. <i>A horror <b>film</b>.</i>
<b>foyer</b>	An entrance hall in a house or flat. <i>The <b>foyer</b> of the concert hall.</i>
<b>histrionic</b>	Excessively theatrical or dramatic in character or style. <i><b>Histrionic</b> gestures.</i>
<b>impresario</b>	A person who organizes and often finances concerts, plays, or operas.
<b>lobby</b>	An interest group that tries to influence legislators or bureaucrats to act in their favor typically through lobbying. <i>Members of the anti abortion <b>lobby</b>.</i>
<b>minstrel</b>	A performer in a minstrel show. <i>The exaggerated dialect of blackface <b>minstrels</b>.</i>
<b>movie</b>	A cinema film. <i>They went to a <b>movie</b> every Saturday night.</i>
<b>musician</b>	Someone who plays a musical instrument (as a profession). <i>Your father was a fine <b>musician</b>.</i>
<b>nickelodeon</b>	A cinema with an admission fee of one nickel.
<b>novelist</b>	One who writes novels.
<b>performer</b>	An entertainer who performs a dramatic or musical work for an audience. <i>A circus <b>performer</b>.</i>
<b>playwright</b>	Someone who writes plays.
<b>preview</b>	A facility for inspecting the appearance of a document before it is printed. <i>The company will <b>preview</b> an enhanced version of its database.</i>
<b>puppet</b>	A small figure of a person operated from above with strings by a puppeteer. <i>A <b>puppet</b> show.</i>
<b>screening</b>	Fabric of metal or plastic mesh. <i>The less than successful <b>screening</b> of the sitcom s pilot episode.</i>
<b>stunt</b>	Perform a stunt or stunts. <i>Some weeds produce chemicals that <b>stunt</b> the plant s growth.</i>

- theatrical** A professional actor or actress.  
*A boarding house that catered for **theatricals**.*
- vaudeville** A light or comic stage play with interspersed songs.  
*His comedic roots are in **vaudeville**.*
- ventriloquist** A person, especially an entertainer, who can make their voice appear to come from somewhere else, typically a dummy of a person or animal.
- video** A recording of moving visual images made digitally or on videotape.  
*They sat down to watch a **video**.*
