Associations of "Thematic" (30 Words)

accompanying	Following or accompanying as a consequence. <i>Owning a home brings with it a horde of accompanying expenses.</i>
accost	Speak to someone. <i>He was accosted by a thief demanding his money or his life.</i>
agenda	The underlying intentions or motives of a particular person or group. <i>The government had its own agenda.</i>
archaeological	Related to or dealing with or devoted to archaeology. <i>The archaeological sites of Mesopotamia.</i>
caption	Provide with a caption as of a photograph or a drawing. <i>The programme has a closing caption thanking the university for its cooperation.</i>
<u>coherence</u>	Logical and orderly and consistent relation of parts. <i>This raises further questions on the coherence of state policy.</i>
communique	An official report (usually sent in haste).
<u>contentious</u>	(of a person) given to provoking argument. <i>A style described as abrasive and contentious.</i>
contents	(usually plural) everything that is included in a collection and that is held or included in something. <i>He emptied the contents of his pockets.</i>
<u>controversial</u>	Marked by or capable of arousing controversy. <i>The issue of the death penalty is highly controversial.</i>
<u>controversy</u>	A contentious speech act; a dispute where there is strong disagreement. <i>The design of the building has caused controversy.</i>
<u>corporeal</u>	Consisting of material objects. <i>Corporeal suffering.</i>

crux	A small conspicuous constellation in the southern hemisphere in the Milky Way near Centaurus. <i>Herein lies the crux of the issue.</i>
<u>debatable</u>	Capable of being disproved. <i>It is debatable whether the country is coming out of recession.</i>
debate	A discussion in which reasons are advanced for and against some proposition or proposal. <i>There has been much debate about prices.</i>
forum	(in an ancient Roman city) a public square or marketplace used for judicial and other business. <i>We hope these pages act as a forum for debate.</i>
heading	The direction or path along which something moves or along which it lies. <i>He crawled on a heading of 90 degrees until he came to the track.</i>
interest	The selfish pursuit of one's own welfare self interest. <i>Efforts were made to interest her in a purchase.</i>
issue	Make out and issue. <i>The chance of carrying such a scheme to a successful issue was small.</i>
item	Also Philip Guedalla used when listing or enumerating items. <i>Item two statute books item two drums.</i>
keynote	Give the keynote address to an audience. <i>Comfort keynotes this designer's Fall collection.</i>
matter	The present state of affairs. <i>He always took some reading matter with him on the plane.</i>
referent	Having reference. <i>Judgments referent to the indictment.</i>
<u>subject</u>	A person who is subjected to experimental or other observational procedures someone who is an object of investigation. <i>Subject to the EC's agreement we intend to set up an enterprise zone in the area.</i>
superman	A man with exceptional physical or mental ability. <i>Appearing in that number of races would have taxed the strength of a superman.</i>
template	Something that serves as a model for others to copy. <i>The plant was to serve as the template for change throughout the company.</i>
theme	Provide with a particular theme or motive. <i>The first violin takes up the theme high up in its register.</i>

- topical** Relating to a particular subject; classified according to subject.
