## Then as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Then" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “then” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Used at the end of a sentence to emphasize an inference being drawn.*
- *At that time; at the time in question.*
- *In that case or as a consequence.*
- *Also; in addition.*
- *In that case; therefore.*
- *Used to finish off a conversation.*
- *After that; next; afterwards.*
- *Subsequently or soon afterward (often used as sentence connectors).*
- *At that time.*

### Synonyms of "Then" as an adverb (19 Words)

<b>additionally</b>	Used to introduce a new fact or argument. <b><i>Additionally</i></b> 50 hours of practical experience will be necessary.
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<b>after that</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time.
<b><u>afterwards</u></b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The offender was arrested shortly <b>afterwards</b>.</i>
<b>also</b>	In addition. <i>A brilliant linguist he was <b>also</b> interested in botany.</i>
<b>and so</b>	In the way indicated; (‘thusly’ is a nonstandard variant).

<b>in addition</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in that case</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>in those days</b>	To or toward the inside of.
<b>later</b>	At a time in the near future; soon or afterwards. <i>I'll see you <b>later</b>.</i>
<b><u>moreover</u></b>	As a further matter; besides. <i><b>Moreover</b> statistics show that competition for places is growing.</i>
<b><u>next</u></b>	At the time or occasion immediately following. <i>Jo was the <b>next</b> oldest after Martin.</i>
<b>over and above that</b>	Throughout a period of time.
<b><u>so</u></b>	Subsequently or soon afterward often used as sentence connectors. <i>And <b>so</b> home and to bed.</i>
<b>subsequently</b>	After a particular thing has happened; afterwards. <i>The officer decided to stop and <b>subsequently</b> made an arrest.</i>
<b>under those circumstances</b>	In or into a state of subordination or subjugation.
<b>what's more</b>	Comparative of much; to a greater degree or extent.

<b>afterward</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>It didn't happen until <b>afterward</b>.</i>
<b>backwards</b>	In a manner or order or direction the reverse of normal. <i>A step <b>backwards</b> for the economy.</i>
<b>behind</b>	A kick that sends the ball over a behind line or a touch that sends it between the inner posts scoring one point. <i>She slid inelegantly down a few steps on her <b>behind</b>.</i>
<b>belated</b>	After the expected or usual time; delayed. <i>A <b>belated</b> birthday card.</i>

<b>following</b>	Immediately following in time or order. <i>The <b>following</b> day.</i>

<b>future</b>	Bulk commodities bought or sold at an agreed price for delivery at a specified future date. <b>Future</b> auxiliary.
<b>hence</b>	From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion hence adv from this place. <b>Hence</b> <i>be gone</i> .
<b>hereby</b>	By means of this. <i>All such warranties are <b>hereby</b> excluded.</i>
<b>hitherto</b>	Until now or until the point in time under discussion. <b>Hitherto</b> <i>part of French West Africa Benin achieved independence in 1960.</i>
<b>late</b>	Of a later stage in the development of a language or literature used especially of dead languages. <i>Their <b>late</b> quarrel.</i>
<b>later</b>	At some eventual time in the future. <b>Later</b> <i>on it will be easier.</i>
<b>next</b>	The next person or thing. <i>The woman in the <b>next</b> room.</i>
<b>past</b>	A verb tense that expresses actions or states in the past. <i>Reporters dug into the candidate s <b>past</b>.</i>
<b>pluperfect</b>	The pluperfect tense. <i>He spoke with <b>pluperfect</b> precision.</i>
<b>posthumous</b>	(of a child) born after the death of its father. <i>He was awarded a <b>posthumous</b> Military Cross.</i>
<b>retrospective</b>	An exhibition or compilation showing the development of an artist's work over a period of time. <i>Our survey was <b>retrospective</b>.</i>
<b>shortly</b>	At a short distance. <i>The book will appear <b>shortly</b>.</i>
<b>so</b>	Subsequently or soon afterward often used as sentence connectors. <i>The bird was about <b>so</b> long.</i>
<b>sometime</b>	At some unspecified or unknown time. <i>The Emperor Constantine used this speech <b>sometime</b> unto his bishops.</i>
<b>subsequently</b>	Happening at a time subsequent to a reference time. <i>The work was accepted for inclusion in the Paris Salon of 1880 and was <b>subsequently</b> sold to an important collector.</i>
<b>there</b>	In that matter. <b>There</b> <i>s a restaurant round the corner.</i>

- thus** From that fact or reason or as a result used to introduce a logical conclusion thus adv in the way indicated thusly is a nonstandard variant.
