Associations of "Theoretically" (30 Words)

analytical	Using or skilled in using analysis (i.e., separating a whole-intellectual or substantial-into its elemental parts or basic principles. <i>An analytical mind.</i>
answerable	Required to explain or justify one’s actions to; responsible or having to report to. <i>Parents are answerable for their child s acts.</i>
apply	Apply oneself to. <i>You need to apply to the local authority for a grant.</i>
chromosome	A threadlike structure of nucleic acids and protein found in the nucleus of most living cells, carrying genetic information in the form of genes. <i>Humans have 22 chromosome pairs plus two sex chromosomes.</i>
<u>defendant</u>	An individual, company, or institution sued or accused in a court of law. <i>The defendant tried to claim that it was self defence.</i>
<u>enigma</u>	A person or thing that is mysterious or difficult to understand. <i>Madeleine was still an enigma to him.</i>
enquire	Have a wish or desire to know something.
<u>exam</u>	A medical test of a specified kind. <i>He was likely to fail his exams again.</i>
factorize	(with reference to a number) resolve or be resolvable into factors. <i>All matrices can be factorized.</i>
<u>inquire</u>	Inquire about. <i>Inquire into the disappearance of the rich old lady.</i>
inquiry	A search for knowledge. <i>New areas of inquiry emerged in the course of the conference.</i>
<u>interrogate</u>	Transmit (a signal) for setting off an appropriate response, as in telecommunication. <i>An interactive system enables users to interrogate the database.</i>

interrogation	A transmission that will trigger an answering transmission from a transponder. <i>He had trouble phrasing his interrogations.</i>
interrogative	Relating to verbs in the so called interrogative mood. <i>Interrogatives are not likely to crop up very often in the speech of a person who is being interviewed.</i>
interrogatory	A written question which is formally put to one party in a case by another party and which must be answered. <i>She abandoned her interrogatory monologue.</i>
interview	Hold an interview with someone. <i>The job candidate interviewed everywhere.</i>
matter	Physical substance in general, as distinct from mind and spirit; (in physics) that which occupies space and possesses rest mass, especially as distinct from energy. <i>Faecal matter.</i>
philosophical	Characterized by the attitude of a philosopher; meeting trouble with level-headed detachment. <i>He was philosophical about losing the contract.</i>
polygraph	A lie detector test carried out with a polygraph. <i>If he passed the polygraph of course it would authenticate his story.</i>
query	Used in writing or speaking to question the accuracy of a following statement or to introduce a question. <i>I rang the water company to query my bill.</i>
question	An instance of questioning. <i>There was a question about my training.</i>
reply	A statement either spoken or written that is made to reply to a question or request or criticism or accusation. <i>I am writing in reply to your letter.</i>
responsible	Being the agent or cause. <i>Gooch was responsible for 198 of his side's 542 runs.</i>
science	A particular area of science. <i>The science of genetics.</i>
solve	Find an answer to, explanation for, or means of effectively dealing with (a problem or mystery). <i>Solve for x.</i>
speculative	Not financially safe or secure. <i>He gave her a speculative glance.</i>

suspect Believe or feel that (someone) is guilty of an illegal, dishonest, or unpleasant act, without certain proof.
*Parents **suspected** of child abuse.*

test Put to the test as for its quality or give experimental use to.
*Eye **tests**.*

testing The act of subjecting to experimental test in order to determine how well something works.
*It involved **testing** thousands of children for smallpox.*

why The cause or intention underlying an action or situation especially in the phrase the whys and wherefores.
***Why** don t I give you a lift.*
