<b>analyst</b>	A psychoanalyst.
<b>head doctor</b>	The striking part of a tool.
<b>healer</b>	A person or thing that mends or repairs something. <i>Sport is a great <b>healer</b> that allows some kind of distraction.</i>
<b>mind doctor</b>	Recall or remembrance.
<b>psychiatrist</b>	A medical practitioner specializing in the diagnosis and treatment of mental illness.
<b>psychoanalyst</b>	A set of techniques for exploring underlying motives and a method of treating various mental disorders; based on the theories of Sigmund Freud.
<b>psychologist</b>	A scientist trained in psychology. <i>A sports <b>psychologist</b>.</i>
<b>psychotherapist</b>	The treatment of mental or emotional problems by psychological means.

## Associations of "Therapist" (30 Words)

<b>acupuncture</b>	Treatment of pain or disease by inserting the tips of needles at specific points on the skin.
<b>biofeedback</b>	A process whereby electronic monitoring of a normally automatic bodily function is used to train someone to acquire voluntary control of that function.
<b>chiroprapist</b>	A person who treats the feet and their ailments. <i>She decided to train as a <b>chiroprapist</b>.</i>
<b>consultant</b>	A person who provides expert advice professionally. <i>A <b>consultant</b> paediatrician.</i>
<b>counselor</b>	Someone who has supervisory duties at a summer camp.
<b><u>cure</u></b>	A medicine or therapy that cures disease or relieve pain. <i>The mastic takes days to <b>cure</b>.</i>
<b>doctor</b>	Treat (someone) medically. <i>She wanted to become a <b>doctor</b>.</i>
<b><u>healer</u></b>	Something that alleviates distress or anguish. <i>Time is the best <b>healer</b>.</i>
<b>herbal</b>	Tea-like drink made of leaves of various herbs. <i><b>Herbal</b> remedies.</i>
<b>homeopathy</b>	A method of treating disease with small amounts of remedies that, in large amounts in healthy people, produce symptoms similar to those being treated.
<b><u>illness</u></b>	A disease or period of sickness affecting the body or mind. <i>He died after a long <b>illness</b>.</i>
<b>injection</b>	Any solution that is injected (as into the skin). <i>The walls have been damp proofed by <b>injection</b>.</i>
<b><u>massage</u></b>	Give a massage to. <i><b>Massage</b> can ease tiredness.</i>
<b>medical</b>	Requiring or amenable to treatment by medicine especially as opposed to surgery. <i>A <b>medical</b> centre.</i>
<b>medicine</b>	Treat medicinally treat with medicine. <i>He studied <b>medicine</b> at Harvard.</i>
<b>nostrum</b>	A scheme or remedy for bringing about some social or political reform or improvement. <i>A charlatan who sells <b>nostrums</b>.</i>

<b>orthopedic</b>	Of or relating to orthopedics. <i>Orthopedic shoes.</i>
<b>osteopath</b>	A therapist who manipulates the skeleton and muscles.
<b>panacea</b>	The goddess of healing; daughter of Aesculapius and sister of Hygeia. <i>The time honoured <b>panacea</b> cod liver oil.</i>
<b>pharmacopoeia</b>	A stock of medicinal drugs.
<b>podiatrist</b>	A person who treats the feet and their ailments; a chiropodist. <i>If a toe has a discharge it is likely infected and needs to be treated by a <b>podiatrist</b>.</i>
<b>psychiatrist</b>	A physician who specializes in psychiatry.
<b>relaxing</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The warm water was very <b>relaxing</b>.</i>
<b>remedy</b>	A medicine or therapy that cures disease or relieve pain. <i>Money will be given to <b>remedy</b> the poor funding of nurseries.</i>
<b>rub</b>	An act of rubbing. <i>He <b>rubbed</b> at the earth on his jeans.</i>
<b>sane</b>	Mentally healthy; free from mental disorder. <i>Hard work kept me <b>sane</b>.</i>
<b>schizophrenia</b>	A long-term mental disorder of a type involving a breakdown in the relation between thought, emotion, and behaviour, leading to faulty perception, inappropriate actions and feelings, withdrawal from reality and personal relationships into fantasy and delusion, and a sense of mental fragmentation. <i>Gibraltar s <b>schizophrenia</b> continues to be fed by colonial pride.</i>
<b>spiritual</b>	Relating to religion or religious belief. <i><b>Spiritual</b> fulfillment.</i>
<b>therapeutic</b>	Tending to cure or restore to health. <i>A <b>therapeutic</b> agent.</i>
<b>treatment</b>	Care provided to improve a situation (especially medical procedures or applications that are intended to relieve illness or injury). <i>Comparison with earlier artists is useful in analysis of the <b>treatment</b> of women in her painting.</i>
