almost	Not quite; very nearly. <i>The baby was almost asleep when the alarm sounded.</i>
anticipatory	In anticipation. <i>An anticipatory flash of excitement.</i>
approximate	Estimate or calculate (a quantity) fairly accurately. <i>Sketched in an approximate likeness.</i>
approximately	(of quantities) imprecise but fairly close to correct. <i>A journey of approximately two hours.</i>
approximation	A thing that is similar to something else, but is not exactly the same. <i>Newspapers gave only an approximation of the actual events.</i>
around	All around or on all sides. <i>Dirty clothes lying around or about.</i>
assumed	Adopted in order to deceive. <i>An assumed name.</i>
assuming	Excessively forward. <i>On a subject like this it would be too assuming for me to decide.</i>
assumption	Audacious (even arrogant) behavior that you have no right to. <i>On the assumption that he has been injured we can infer that he will not play.</i>
conceivable	Capable of being imagined or grasped mentally. <i>A mass uprising was entirely conceivable.</i>
contemplate	Think deeply and at length. <i>She couldn't even begin to contemplate the future.</i>
equidistant	At equal distances. <i>The line joins together all points which are equidistant from the two axes.</i>

estimate	Judge tentatively or form an estimate of quantities or time. <i>It is estimated that smoking causes 100 000 premature deaths every year.</i>
expect	Consider obligatory request and expect. <i>I m expecting a full explanation as to why these files were destroyed.</i>
guess	Form a correct conclusion about something by guessing. <i>I am guessing that the price of real estate will rise again.</i>
infer	Believe to be the case. <i>From these facts we can infer that crime has been increasing.</i>
inference	The process of inferring something. <i>His emphasis on order and health and by inference cleanliness.</i>
mull	Think about (a fact, proposal, or request) deeply and at length. <i>She began to mull over the various possibilities.</i>
nearly	Slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but. <i>He nearly fainted.</i>
ponder	Think about (something) carefully, especially before making a decision or reaching a conclusion. <i>She sat pondering over her problem.</i>
proximate	Nearly accurate approximate. <i>The failure of the proximate military power to lend assistance.</i>
reckon	Deem to be. <i>I reckon I can manage that.</i>
roughly	With roughness or violence rough is an informal variant for roughly. <i>People were crouching over roughly built brick fireplaces.</i>
ruminate	Reflect deeply on a subject. <i>Goats ruminated nonchalantly around them.</i>
some	To some extent quite a lot. <i>Some apples.</i>
speculate	Invest in stocks, property, or other ventures in the hope of gain but with the risk of loss. <i>Philosophers have speculated on the question of God for thousands of years.</i>
speculation	A message expressing an opinion based on incomplete evidence. <i>There has been widespread speculation that he plans to quit.</i>
suppose	Take for granted or as a given suppose beforehand. <i>I m quite a good actress I suppose.</i>

surmise

A supposition that something may be true, even though there is no evidence to confirm it.

*Charles was glad to have his **surmise** confirmed.*

virtually

(of actions or states) slightly short of or not quite accomplished; all but.

*The disease destroyed **virtually** all the vineyards in Orange County.*
