ratiocination The proposition arrived at by logical reasoning (such as the proposition that

reckon Expect, believe, or suppose.

In college he was always **reckon**ed among the brainiest.

ruminate Chew the cuds. Cows ruminate.

Invest in stocks, property, or other ventures in the hope of gain but with

that the speaker doubts the truth of the statement.

supposedly

There were rumours of a rift between him and his colleagues supposedly

because they were jealous of his relationship with the Duchess.

A belief held without proof or certain knowledge; an assumption or

supposition hypothesis.

They were working on the **supposition** that his death was murder.
