According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “thirsty” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *(usually followed by `for') extremely desirous.*
- *Having or showing a strong desire for something.*
- *(of an engine, plant, or crop) consuming a lot of fuel or water.*
- *(of land or plants) in need of water; dry or parched.*
- *Extremely desirous.*
- *Feeling a need or desire to drink.*
- *(of activity, weather, or a time) causing thirst.*
- *Having or showing strong sexual desire for someone.*
- *Feeling a need to drink something.*
- *Able to take in large quantities of moisture.*
- *Needing moisture.*

Lacking vitality or spirit; lifeless.

His **arid** years in suburbia.

athirst

Thirsty.

Athirst for knowledge.

avid

Having an eager desire for.

She was **avid** for information about the murder inquiry.

baked

Dried out by heat or excessive exposure to sunlight.

Baked apples.

burning

Of immediate import.

He had a **burning** ambition to climb to the upper reaches of management.

dehydrated

Suffering from excessive loss of water from the body.

Dehydrated mashed potatoes.

desiccated	Preserved by removing natural moisture. <i>Desiccated coconut.</i>
desirous	Having or expressing desire for something. <i>The Pope was desirous of peace in Europe.</i>
dried out	Not still wet.
dried up	Not still wet.
dry	Of noodles not served in a soup but in a sauce or with dry ingredients. <i>Rattled off the facts in a dry mechanical manner.</i>
eager	Strongly wanting to do or have something. <i>Young intellectuals eager for knowledge.</i>
greedy	Immoderately desirous of acquiring e.g. wealth. <i>Greedy for fame.</i>
hungry	Causing hunger. <i>I was feeling ravenously hungry.</i>
in need of a drink	Directed or bound inward.
longing	Having or showing a yearning desire. <i>Her longing eyes.</i>
parched	Extremely thirsty. <i>Parched corn.</i>
waterless	Lacking sufficient water or rainfall. <i>A waterless well.</i>
yearning	Involving or expressing yearning. <i>A yearning hope.</i>



Usage Examples of "Thirsty" as an adjective

- *A huge thirsty 5.3-litre engine.*
- *Thirsty fields under a rainless sky.*
- *Farmers still grow thirsty crops like rice and alfalfa.*
- *Joe was as thirsty for scandal as anyone else.*
- *The Guides were hot and thirsty.*
- *The earth was dry and thirsty.*
- *She's not even looking at you. Stop being so thirsty.*
- *Modelling is thirsty work.*
- *Thirsty towels.*

- dampness** The state or condition of being slightly wet.
*The **dampness** in the air.*
- dehydrate** Preserve by removing all water and liquids from.
*The heat **dehydrated** us even when we stood still.*
- drench** Drench or submerge or be drenched or submerged.
*A **drench** of sack.*

drenched	Abundantly covered or supplied with; often used in combination. <i>Drenched in moonlight.</i>
dry	A dry or covered place. <i>He s been dry for ten years.</i>
dusty	Covered with, full of, or resembling dust. <i>A dusty pile of books.</i>
evaporation	The process of extracting moisture. <i>Thousands of employees witnessed the rapid evaporation of their retirement plans.</i>
humid	Containing or characterized by a great deal of water vapor. <i>Humid weather.</i>
humidity	A quantity representing the amount of water vapour in the atmosphere or in a gas. <i>The humidity should be supplied by regularly spraying the leaves.</i>
hungry	Having a strong desire or craving. <i>A party hungry for power.</i>
jungle	A location marked by an intense competition and struggle for survival. <i>It s a jungle out there.</i>
marshland	Land consisting of marshes. <i>Marshland landscapes.</i>
marshy	Characteristic of or resembling a marsh; waterlogged. <i>A marshy coastline.</i>
moist	Marked by a fluid discharge. <i>Eyes moist with tears.</i>
moisture	Water or other liquid diffused in a small quantity as vapour, within a solid, or condensed on a surface. <i>In freshly felled wood the moisture content varies.</i>
moisturize	Make (more) humid. <i>Revitalize your face moisturize your skin.</i>
parched	Dried out with heat. <i>The parched earth.</i>
precipitation	The quantity of water falling to earth at a specific place within a specified period of time. <i>Cora was already regretting her precipitation.</i>
semiarid	Somewhat arid. <i>A semiarid region with little annual rainfall.</i>

soggy	Having the consistency of dough because of insufficient leavening or improper cooking. <i>We squelched through the soggy ground.</i>
sponge	Gather sponges in the ocean. <i>She repainted the walls white then sponged them in turquoise green and lilac.</i>
swampy	Characteristic of or resembling a swamp. <i>A swampy area.</i>
thirst	Strong desire for something (not food or drink). <i>A few could drink while many thirsted.</i>
tropics	The part of the Earth's surface between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn; characterized by a hot climate.
<u>unquenchable</u>	Not able to be quenched. <i>His enthusiasm was unquenchable.</i>
vapor	The process of becoming a vapor.
<u>wet</u>	Make one's bed or clothes wet by urinating. <i>This eight year old boy still wets his bed.</i>
