
Thirsty as an Adjective

- (of an engine, plant, or crop) consuming a lot of fuel or water.
- (of land or plants) in need of water; dry or parched.
- Extremely desirous.
- Feeling a need or desire to drink.
- (of activity, weather, or a time) causing thirst.
- Having or showing strong sexual desire for someone.
- Feeling a need to drink something.
- Able to take in large quantities of moisture.
- Needing moisture.
