## Associations of "Though" (30 Words)

already Used after a word or phrase to express impatience.

Anna has suffered a great deal already.

**but** An argument against something; an objection.

Hopes that last **but** a moment.

despite Contemptuous disregard.

The theatre only earns my **despite**.

Denoting or relating to a race or other sporting event that takes place

**endurance** over a long distance or otherwise demands great physical stamina.

The annual 24 hour **endurance** race.

Used in negative statement to describe a situation that has existed up to

**heretofore** this point or up to the present time.

Diseases that **heretofore** were usually confined to rural areas.

1960.
