artistic	Satisfying aesthetic standards and sensibilities. <i>A denial of artistic freedom.</i>
brainstorming	A group problem-solving technique in which members spontaneously share ideas and solutions. <i>Brainstorming can generate some wonderful ideas.</i>
commonsensical	Exhibiting native good judgment. <i>Unlearned and commonsensical countryfolk were capable of solving problems that beset the more sophisticated.</i>
conceivable	Capable of being imagined or grasped mentally. <i>In every conceivable way that action was entirely wrong.</i>
conceive	Have the idea for. <i>A brilliantly conceived and executed robbery.</i>
conceptualize	Have the idea for. <i>Sex was conceptualized as an overpowering force in the individual.</i>
creative	A person whose job involves creative work. <i>The most important people in the mix will be creatives and direct marketing specialists.</i>
creativity	The ability to create. <i>Firms are keen to encourage creativity.</i>
defeatist	A person who expects or is excessively ready to accept failure. <i>We have a duty not to be so defeatist.</i>
exclude	Prevent from entering; keep out. <i>The unruly student was excluded from the game.</i>
extrapolation	The action of estimating or concluding something by assuming that existing trends will continue or a current method will remain applicable. <i>Caution is advised in the interpretation and extrapolation of results.</i>
genius	Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field. <i>Boucher s paintings did not suit the austere genius of neoclassicism.</i>

groundbreaking	The ceremonial breaking of the ground to formally begin a construction project. <i>Groundbreaking research into fertility problems.</i>
idea	A mental impression. <i>He has an idea that we don't like him.</i>
imagery	Visually descriptive or figurative language, especially in a literary work. <i>Tennyson uses imagery to create a lyrical emotion.</i>
imaginable	Capable of being imagined. <i>The most spectacular views imaginable.</i>
imaginative	Marked by independence and creativity in thought or action- Lewis Mumford. <i>He was imaginative beyond all other architects.</i>
innovative	(of a product, idea, etc.) featuring new methods; advanced and original. <i>Stylistically innovative works.</i>
inventive	Having the ability to create or design new things or to think originally. <i>Had an inventive turn of mind.</i>
judiciousness	The trait of forming opinions by distinguishing and evaluating.
mentality	Mental ability. <i>Machines can possess mentality.</i>
minded	Interested in or enthusiastic about a particular thing. <i>Career minded.</i>
notion	(usually plural) small personal articles or clothing or sewing items. <i>Children have different notions about the roles of their parents.</i>
objectively	In a way that is not dependent on the mind for existence; actually. <i>The researchers are objectively assessing risk factors.</i>
philosophical	Characterized by the attitude of a philosopher; meeting trouble with level-headed detachment. <i>Philosophical writing.</i>
reasoning	Endowed with the capacity to reason. <i>He explained the reasoning behind his decision at a media conference.</i>
resourceful	Having inner resources; adroit or imaginative. <i>You will become stronger and more resourceful in the face of adversity.</i>
sagacity	The mental ability to understand and discriminate between relations. <i>A man of great political sagacity.</i>
think	An act of thinking. <i>I think that he is her boyfriend.</i>
