- Having the nap worn away so that the threads show through.
- Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.
- (of an argument, excuse, idea, etc.) used so often that it is no longer effective.
- (of a person, building, or room) poor or shabby in appearance.
- (of cloth, clothing, or soft furnishings) becoming thin and tattered with age.

tattered Worn to shreds; or wearing torn or ragged clothing.

An old woman in tattered clothes.

thin Relatively thin in consistency or low in density not viscous.

Tall **thin** lettering.

timeworn Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.

Parroting some **timeworn** axiom.

tired Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.

A few boxes of **tired** vegetables.

trite Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.

His remarks were **trite** and commonplace.

well worn Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.

well-worn Repeated too often; overfamiliar through overuse.

Affected by wear; damaged by long use.

Looking careworn as she bent over her mending.
