blessedness	A state of supreme happiness.
contentment	A state of happiness and satisfaction. <i>He found contentment in living a simple life in the country.</i>
delectation	Act of receiving pleasure from something. <i>They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our delectation.</i>
delighted	Greatly pleased. <i>We were delighted to see her.</i>
elated	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>The elated winner.</i>
enjoyable	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. <i>They had an enjoyable afternoon.</i>
enthusiasm	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>Few expressed enthusiasm about the current leaders.</i>
euphoria	A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness. <i>In his euphoria he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
excited	Excessively affected by emotion. <i>They were excited about the prospect.</i>
excitement	Something that arouses a feeling of excitement. <i>He looked forward to the excitements of the day.</i>
exuberance	Joyful enthusiasm. <i>A sense of youthful exuberance.</i>
exult	Feel or show triumphant elation or jubilation. <i>Who cannot exult in Spring.</i>
exultant	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the exultant crowds.</i>
fun	A source of fun. <i>A school fun day.</i>

gaiety	Lively celebration or festivities. <i>He seemed to be a part of the gaiety having a wonderful time.</i>
glad	Any of numerous plants of the genus <i>Gladiolus</i> native chiefly to tropical and South Africa having sword-shaped leaves and one-sided spikes of brightly colored funnel-shaped flowers; widely cultivated. <i>She was glad of Hank's lively company.</i>
gladden	Make glad. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that gladdened her heart.</i>
gratify	Make happy or satisfied. <i>She was gratified to see the shock in Jim's eyes.</i>
happiness	Emotions experienced when in a state of well-being. <i>She struggled to find happiness in her life.</i>
happy	Fortunate and convenient. <i>I'm happy with his performance.</i>
joy	A thing that causes joy. <i>Tears of joy.</i>
merriment	Gaiety and fun. <i>Her eyes sparkled with merriment.</i>
pleasant	Having pleasing manners or behavior. <i>A very pleasant evening.</i>
please	Wish or desire to do something. <i>He arranged a fishing trip to please his son.</i>
pleasure	Something or someone that provides a source of happiness. <i>Tell me what will pleasure you.</i>
rapture	(according to some millenarian teaching) the transporting of believers to heaven at the Second Coming of Christ. <i>Listening to sweet music in a perfect rapture.</i>
rapturous	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with rapturous applause.</i>
rejoice	Feel happiness or joy. <i>The guard rejoiced in the name of Blossom.</i>
thrill	Cause to be thrilled by some perceptual input. <i>The shock of alarm thrilled through her.</i>
willingness	Cheerful compliance. <i>He expressed his willingness to help.</i>
