## Associations of "Thrilled" (30 Words)

<b>blessedness</b>	A state of supreme happiness.
<b>contentment</b>	A state of happiness and satisfaction. <i>He found <b>contentment</b> in living a simple life in the country.</i>
<b>delectation</b>	Act of receiving pleasure from something. <i>They had all manner of rock n roll goodies for our <b>delectation</b>.</i>
<b>delighted</b>	Greatly pleased. <i>We were <b>delighted</b> to see her.</i>
<b>elated</b>	Full of high-spirited delight. <i>The <b>elated</b> winner.</i>
<b>enjoyable</b>	(of an activity or occasion) giving delight or pleasure. <i>They had an <b>enjoyable</b> afternoon.</i>
<b>enthusiasm</b>	Something that arouses enthusiasm. <i>Few expressed <b>enthusiasm</b> about the current leaders.</i>
<b>euphoria</b>	A feeling or state of intense excitement and happiness. <i>In his <b>euphoria</b> he had become convinced he could defeat them.</i>
<b>excited</b>	Excessively affected by emotion. <i>They were <b>excited</b> about the prospect.</i>
<b>excitement</b>	Something that arouses a feeling of excitement. <i>He looked forward to the <b>excitements</b> of the day.</i>
<b>exuberance</b>	Joyful enthusiasm. <i>A sense of youthful <b>exuberance</b>.</i>
<b>exult</b>	Feel or show triumphant elation or jubilation. <i>Who cannot <b>exult</b> in Spring.</i>
<b>exultant</b>	Joyful and proud especially because of triumph or success. <i>He waved to the <b>exultant</b> crowds.</i>
<b>fun</b>	A source of fun. <i>A school <b>fun</b> day.</i>

<b>gaiety</b>	Lively celebration or festivities. <i>He seemed to be a part of the <b>gaiety</b> having a wonderful time.</i>
<b>glad</b>	Any of numerous plants of the genus <i>Gladiolus</i> native chiefly to tropical and South Africa having sword-shaped leaves and one-sided spikes of brightly colored funnel-shaped flowers; widely cultivated. <i>She was <b>glad</b> of Hank's lively company.</i>
<b>gladden</b>	Make glad. <i>The high childish laugh was a sound that <b>gladdened</b> her heart.</i>
<b>gratify</b>	Make happy or satisfied. <i>She was gratified to see the shock in Jim's eyes.</i>
<b>happiness</b>	Emotions experienced when in a state of well-being. <i>She struggled to find <b>happiness</b> in her life.</i>
<b>happy</b>	Fortunate and convenient. <i>I'm <b>happy</b> with his performance.</i>
<b>joy</b>	A thing that causes joy. <i>Tears of <b>joy</b>.</i>
<b>merriment</b>	Gaiety and fun. <i>Her eyes sparkled with <b>merriment</b>.</i>
<b>pleasant</b>	Having pleasing manners or behavior. <i>A very <b>pleasant</b> evening.</i>
<b>please</b>	Wish or desire to do something. <i>He arranged a fishing trip to <b>please</b> his son.</i>
<b>pleasure</b>	Something or someone that provides a source of happiness. <i>Tell me what will <b>pleasure</b> you.</i>
<b>rapture</b>	(according to some millenarian teaching) the transporting of believers to heaven at the Second Coming of Christ. <i>Listening to sweet music in a perfect <b>rapture</b>.</i>
<b>rapturous</b>	Characterized by, feeling, or expressing great pleasure or enthusiasm. <i>He was greeted with <b>rapturous</b> applause.</i>
<b>rejoice</b>	Feel happiness or joy. <i>The guard <b>rejoiced</b> in the name of Blossom.</i>
<b>thrill</b>	Cause to be thrilled by some perceptual input. <i>The shock of alarm <b>thrilled</b> through her.</i>
<b>willingness</b>	Cheerful compliance. <i>He expressed his <b>willingness</b> to help.</i>
