animated	Made to appear to move as living creatures do. <i>An animated and expressive face.</i>
<u>dramatic</u>	Used of a singer or singing voice that is marked by power and expressiveness and a histrionic or theatrical style. <i>With a dramatic gesture she put a hand to her brow.</i>
<u>electrifying</u>	Arousing a sudden sense of great excitement; thrilling. <i>Tens of thousands of fans were treated to an electrifying performance.</i>
emotional	Of or pertaining to emotion. <i>He would become emotional over nothing at all.</i>
emotive	Expressing a person's feelings rather than being neutrally descriptive. <i>The comparisons are emotive rather than analytic.</i>

exciting	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>An exciting account of her trip.</i>
fascinating	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. <i>A fascinating woman.</i>
gripping	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. <i>A gripping TV thriller.</i>
hair-raising	Extremely alarming.
heady	Having a strong or exhilarating effect. <i>The heady days of my youth.</i>
impassioned	Filled with or showing great emotion. <i>She made an impassioned plea for help.</i>
inspirational	Providing or showing creative or spiritual inspiration. <i>The team s inspirational captain.</i>
inspiring	Having the effect of inspiring someone. <i>He was an inspiring teacher.</i>
lively	Full of spirit; full of life. <i>A lively gait.</i>
moving	In motion. <i>A constantly moving crowd.</i>
passionate	Arising from intense feelings of sexual love. <i>He s passionate about football.</i>
rip-roaring	Uncontrollably noisy.
riveting	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. <i>The book is a riveting account of the legendary freedom fighter.</i>
rousing	Rousing to activity or heightened action as by spurring or goading. <i>A fine rousing fire that will soon warm you.</i>
soul-stirring	Exciting strong but not unpleasant emotions.
spirited	Made lively or spirited. <i>A spirited campaigner for women s rights.</i>
stimulating	Making lively and cheerful. <i>A stimulating discussion.</i>
stirring	Exciting strong but not unpleasant emotions. <i>A stirring and thriving politician.</i>

adventure	Excitement associated with danger or the taking of risks. <i>She travelled the world in search of adventure.</i>
amusing	Causing laughter and providing entertainment. <i>An amusing film with a steady stream of pranks and pratfalls.</i>
diverting	Entertaining or amusing. <i>A diverting story.</i>
enchanting	Delightfully charming or attractive. <i>Enchanting views.</i>
engrossing	Absorbing all one's attention or interest. <i>The most engrossing parts of the book.</i>

<u>entertaining</u>	Providing amusement or enjoyment. <i>A charming and entertaining companion.</i>
enthralling	Capturing and holding one's attention; fascinating. <i>An enthralling book.</i>
<u>entrancing</u>	Capable of attracting and holding interest; charming. <i>I find you entrancing.</i>
<u>escapade</u>	An act or incident involving excitement, daring, or adventure. <i>He told of their escapade with a borrowed truck.</i>
exciting	Stimulating interest and discussion. <i>One of the most exciting matches I've ever seen.</i>
<u>exhilarating</u>	Making one feel very happy, animated, or elated; thrilling. <i>The exhilarating effect of mountain air.</i>
fascinated	Having your attention fixated as though by a spell. <i>A crowd of fascinated onlookers.</i>
<u>fascinating</u>	Capable of arousing and holding the attention. <i>A fascinating story.</i>
flushed	Reddened or suffused with or as if with blood from emotion or exertion. <i>Flushed or crimson with embarrassment.</i>
fun	A source of fun. <i>It was a fun evening.</i>
funny	Used to emphasize that something is serious or should be taken seriously. <i>The play is hilariously funny.</i>
humorous	Full of or characterized by humor. <i>Humorous stories.</i>
interesting	Arousing or holding the attention. <i>It will be very interesting to see what they come up with.</i>
intriguing	Arousing one's curiosity or interest; fascinating. <i>It's an intriguing possibility.</i>
<u>irresistible</u>	Too attractive and tempting to be resisted. <i>She felt an irresistible urge to object.</i>
<u>odyssey</u>	A Greek epic poem (attributed to Homer) describing the journey of Odysseus after the fall of Troy. <i>His odyssey from military man to politician.</i>
rapturous	Feeling great rapture or delight. <i>He was greeted with rapturous applause.</i>
<u>riveting</u>	Completely engrossing; compelling. <i>The book is a riveting account of the legendary freedom fighter.</i>

sensational Causing great public interest and excitement.
*You look **sensational**.*

stardom The status of being acknowledged as a star.
Stardom meant nothing to her.

stimulant Raising levels of physiological or nervous activity in the body.
*It is a **stimulant** that has a direct effect on the nervous system.*

stimulating Making lively and cheerful.
*A rich and **stimulating** working environment.*
