- *Prosper; flourish.*
- *Make steady progress; be at the high point in one's career or reach a high point in historical significance or importance.*
- *Grow vigorously.*
- *(of a child, animal, or plant) grow or develop well or vigorously.*



## Synonyms of "Thrive" as a verb (18 Words)

<b>advance</b>	Pay in advance. <i>The troops <b>advanced</b> on the capital.</i>
<b><u>advancing</u></b>	Move forward, also in the metaphorical sense.
<b><u>bloom</u></b>	Produce flowers; be in flower. <i>The cherry tree <b>bloomed</b>.</i>
<b><u>blossom</u></b>	(of a tree or bush) produce flowers or masses of flowers. <i>Their friendship <b>blossomed</b> into romance.</i>
<b><u>boom</u></b>	Say in a loud, deep, resonant voice. <i>Business is <b>booming</b>.</i>
<b><u>burgeon</u></b>	Put forth young shoots; bud. <i>The city's suburbs have <b>burgeoned</b> sprawling out from the centre.</i>
<b><u>burgeoning</u></b>	Grow and flourish.
<b>develop well</b>	Make visible by means of chemical solutions.

<b>do well</b>	Behave in a certain manner; show a certain behavior; conduct or comport oneself.
<b>expand</b>	Expand the influence of. <i>Their business <b>expanded</b> into other hotels.</i>
<b>flourish</b>	Grow vigorously. <i>The organization has continued to <b>flourish</b>.</i>
<b>fly high</b>	Transport by aeroplane.
<b>grow vigorously</b>	Grow emotionally or mature.
<b>make strides</b>	Represent fictitiously, as in a play, or pretend to be or act like.
<b>progressing</b>	Move forward, also in the metaphorical sense.
<b>prosper</b>	Succeed in material terms; be financially successful. <i>Areas where grey squirrels cannot <b>prosper</b>.</i>
<b>prospering</b>	Make steady progress; be at the high point in one's career or reach a high point in historical significance or importance.
<b>succeed</b>	Attain fame, wealth, or social status. <i>Keep trying and you will eventually <b>succeed</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Thrive" (30 Words)

<b>abound</b>	Be abundant or plentiful; exist in large quantities. <i>The room <b>abounded</b> with screaming children.</i>
<b>abundant</b>	Existing or available in large quantities; plentiful. <i>The riverbanks were <b>abundant</b> in beautiful wild plants.</i>
<b>affluence</b>	Abundant wealth. <i>A sign of our growing <b>affluence</b>.</i>
<u><b>affluent</b></u>	An affluent person a person who is financially well off. <i>An <b>affluent</b> banker.</i>
<u><b>bloom</b></u>	A full, bright sound in a recording. <i>A chalk pit where cowslips <b>bloomed</b>.</i>
<u><b>blossom</b></u>	The state or period of flowering. <i>Fruit trees in <b>blossom</b>.</i>

<b>bonanza</b>	An especially rich vein of precious ore. <i>A <b>bonanza</b> year for the computer industry.</i>
<b>bonus</b>	A sum of money added to a person's wages as a reward for good performance. <i>Big Christmas <b>bonuses</b>.</i>
<b>boom</b>	Hit hard. <i>The deep <b>boom</b> of the bass drum.</i>
<b>booming</b>	Struck with great force. <i>A <b>booming</b> kick from the touchline.</i>
<b>burgeon</b>	Begin to grow or increase rapidly; flourish. <i>The city's suburbs have <b>burgeoned</b> sprawling out from the centre.</i>
<b>daisy</b>	Used in names of other plants of the daisy family e.g. Michaelmas daisy Shasta daisy.
<b>ding</b>	Go ding dong like a bell. <i>Cash registers were <b>dinging</b> softly.</i>
<b>efflorescence</b>	A powdery deposit on a surface. <i><b>Efflorescences</b> found on the sheltered undersides of shale ledges.</i>
<b>fanfare</b>	A gaudy outward display. <i>A specially composed <b>fanfare</b> announced the arrival of the Duchess.</i>
<b>flourish</b>	(music) a short lively tune played on brass instruments. <i>Wild plants <b>flourish</b> on the banks of the lake.</i>
<b>flourishing</b>	Very lively and profitable. <i>A <b>flourishing</b> career.</i>
<b>grow</b>	Cultivate by growing often involving improvements by means of agricultural techniques. <i>Her hair doesn't <b>grow</b> much anymore.</i>
<b>growth</b>	Something grown or growing. <i>A <b>growth</b> of trees.</i>
<b>inflation</b>	Lack of elegance as a consequence of being pompous and puffed up with vanity. <i>The gross <b>inflation</b> of salaries.</i>
<b>metropolis</b>	A very large and busy city. <i>By the late eighteenth century Edo had grown to a <b>metropolis</b> with a population of nearly one million.</i>
<b>palmy</b>	Covered with palms. <i>The <b>palmy</b> days of the 1970s.</i>



<b>profitable</b>	Yielding material gain or profit. <i><b>Profitable</b> speculation on the stock market.</i>
<b>prosper</b>	Succeed in material terms; be financially successful. <i>Areas where grey squirrels cannot <b>prosper</b>.</i>
<b>prosperous</b>	In fortunate circumstances financially; moderately rich. <i>A <b>prosperous</b> new business.</i>
<b>rich</b>	Marked by richness and fullness of flavor. <i><b>Rich</b> countries can afford to spend money on the environment.</i>
<b>successful</b>	Having succeeded or being marked by a favorable outcome. <i>Marketing of Japanese products has been highly <b>successful</b>.</i>
<b>thriving</b>	Very lively and profitable. <i>The <b>thriving</b> business George has built up.</i>
<b>well-to-do</b>	Give rise to; cause to happen or occur, not always intentionally. Fruit that has fallen from the tree.
<b>windfall</b>	<i>Members are to get an average 520 cash <b>windfall</b> for voting yes to the merger.</i>
