A feeling of intense annoyance caused by being tormented. torment

The journey must have been a **torment** for them.

Unbearable physical pain. torture

Harass the enemy.

Hurt the feelings of. hurt Ow You re **hurt**ing me.

Cause damage or affect negatively.

injure The explosion **injure**d several people.

Irregularly slashed and jagged as if torn.

lacerate The point had **lacerate**d his neck.

Split wood with a maul and wedges. maul

The body was badly **maul**ed in battle.

A person who is constantly miserable or discontented. misery

The **misery** and wretchedness of those slums is intolerable.

Cause mental or physical pain to. pain

She took **pain**s to see that everyone ate well.

Blemished by injury or rough wear. scarred

A face **scarred** by anxiety.

Undergo or suffer. suffer

France will no longer **suffer** the existing government.

Psychological suffering. suffering **Suffering** refugees.

A deep pulsating type of pain. throb

The crowded streets **throb**bed with life.

A deeply distressing or disturbing experience. trauma

Many experience the **trauma** of divorce.

Showing distress or anxiety. troubled

Troubled areas.
