### Definitions of "Throne" as a noun

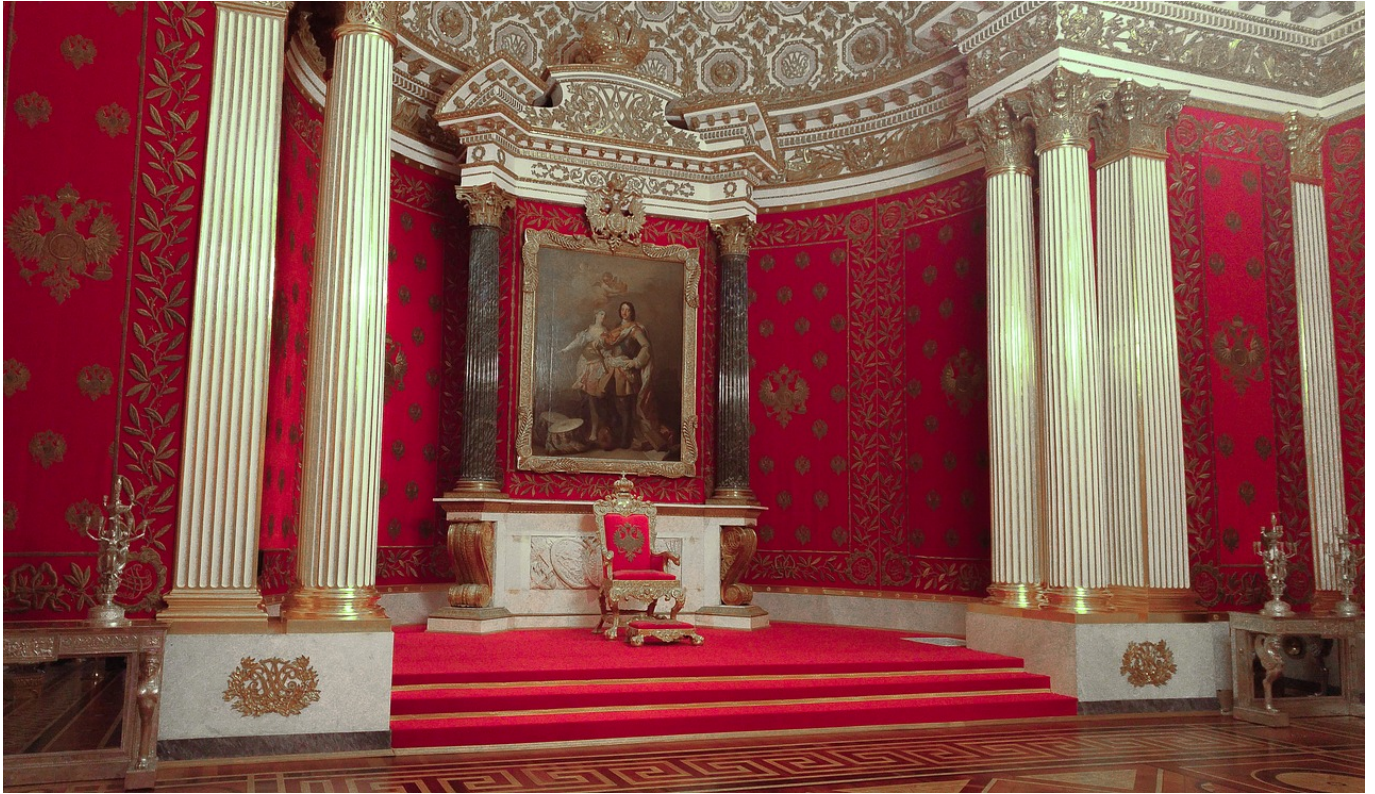
According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “throne” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The position and power of an exalted person (a sovereign or bishop) who is entitled to sit in a chair of state on ceremonial occasions.*
- *A toilet.*
- *A ceremonial chair for a sovereign, bishop, or similar figure.*
- *The chair of state for a monarch, bishop, etc.*
- *A plumbing fixture for defecation and urination.*
- *(in traditional Christian angelology) the third-highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy.*
- *Used to signify sovereign power.*

<b>command</b>	The power or authority to command. <i>An officer took <b>command</b>.</i>
<b>commode</b>	A tall elegant chest of drawers.
<b>crapper</b>	A plumbing fixture for defecation and urination.
<b><u>dominion</u></b>	One of the self-governing nations in the British Commonwealth. <i>The Angevin <b>dominions</b>.</i>
<b>royal seat</b>	Stag with antlers of 12 or more branches.
<b>rule</b>	A rule describing or prescribing a linguistic practice. <i>He knew the <b>rules</b> of chess.</i>
<b>seat of state</b>	The cloth covering for the buttocks.
<b>sovereign power</b>	A nation's ruler or head of state usually by hereditary right.
<b>sovereignty</b>	Royal authority; the dominion of a monarch. <i>National <b>sovereignty</b>.</i>
<b>stool</b>	The stump of a tree that has been felled or headed for the production of saplings. <i>Concentrations of the substance in normal <b>stool</b>.</i>
<b>toilet</b>	A room building or cubicle containing a toilet or toilets. <i>Her <b>toilet</b> completed she finally went back downstairs.</i>

- *King Solomon's great ivory throne.*



## Throne as a Verb

### Definitions of "Throne" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "throne" as a verb can have the following

definitions:

- *Put a monarch on the throne.*
- *Sit on the throne as a ruler.*
- *Place (someone) on a throne.*



## Synonyms of "Throne" as a verb (1 Word)

**enthrone** Provide with power and authority.  
*He was **enthroned** as the guru of the avant garde.*





## Usage Examples of "Throne" as a verb

- *The king was throned on a rock.*
- *The Queen was enthroned more than 50 years ago.*

### **abdicate**

Give up, such as power, as of monarchs and emperors, or duties and obligations.

*Ferdinand **abdicated** the throne in favour of the emperor's brother.*

### **accession**

The action or process of formally joining or being accepted by an institution or group.

*Substantial **accessions** of gold.*

### **admission**

The fee charged for admission.

*Cinema **admissions** have been rising recently.*

<b>admittance</b>	The act of admitting someone to enter. <i>People were unable to gain <b>admittance</b> to the hall.</i>
<b>coronal</b>	Of or in the coronal plane. <b>Coronal</b> imaging.
<b><u>crown</u></b>	Dentistry dental appliance consisting of an artificial crown for a broken or decayed tooth. <i>Shiny covers embossed with gold <b>crowns</b>.</i>
<b>diadem</b>	A jewelled crown or headband worn as a symbol of sovereignty. <i>He refused the <b>diadem</b> of all the Caesars.</i>
<b>duke</b>	A male holding the highest hereditary title in the British and certain other peerages.
<b><u>dynasty</u></b>	A line of hereditary rulers of a country. <i>The Tang <b>dynasty</b>.</i>
<b><u>emperor</u></b>	The male ruler of an empire. <i>He is regarded as one of the greatest Roman <b>emperors</b>.</i>
<b>enthrone</b>	Install (a monarch or bishop) on a throne, especially during a ceremony to mark the beginning of their rule. <i>The Queen was <b>enthroned</b> more than 50 years ago.</i>
<b>fief</b>	A person's sphere of operation or control.
<b><u>king</u></b>	Make someone king. <i>He ll start <b>kinging</b> it over the lot of us again.</i>
<b><u>kingdom</u></b>	A country, state, or territory ruled by a king or queen. <i>The untroubled <b>kingdom</b> of reason.</i>
<b>kingship</b>	The state or position of being a king. <i>Upon his succession to the <b>kingship</b> David retained his English estates.</i>
<b><u>lord</u></b>	Make a lord of someone. <b>Lords</b> and ladies were entertained here.
<b>papacy</b>	The tenure of office of a pope. <i>Relations between the English state and the <b>papacy</b>.</i>
<b>papal</b>	Relating to a pope or to the papacy. <b>Papal</b> dispensation.
<b>pontifical</b>	Denoting or governed by or relating to a bishop or bishops. <i>Such explanations were greeted with <b>pontifical</b> disdain.</i>
<b>pope</b>	The head of the Coptic Church, the Bishop or Patriarch of Alexandria.
<b>preferment</b>	Promotion or appointment to a position or office. <i>Most of her ministers owed their first <b>preferment</b> to her.</i>

<b>prince</b>	A male member of a royal family other than the sovereign (especially the son of a sovereign. <i>Arctic char is a <b>prince</b> among fishes.</i>
<b>princess</b>	A close female relative of a monarch, especially a granddaughter. <i>Stop being such a <b>princess</b>.</i>
<u><b>proclamation</b></u>	The public or official announcement of an important matter. <i>The issuing by the monarch of a <b>proclamation</b> dissolving Parliament.</i>
<b>queen</b>	Become a queen. <i>The <b>queen</b> of ocean liners.</i>
<b>regency</b>	The particular period of a regency especially in Britain from 1811 to 1820 and in France from 1715 to 1723. <i>The boy being a minor there would have to be a <b>regency</b>.</i>
<u><b>royal</b></u>	A sail set next above the topgallant on a royal mast. <i>The coalition obtained <b>royal</b> approval for the appointment.</i>
<u><b>sovereign</b></u>	Possessing royal power and status. <i>In modern democracies the people s will is in theory <b>sovereign</b>.</i>
<b>vassal</b>	A holder of land by feudal tenure on conditions of homage and allegiance. <i>A <b>vassal</b> state of the Ottoman Empire.</i>
<u><b>wreath</b></u>	A carved representation of a wreath. <i>The Queen laid a <b>wreath</b> at the Cenotaph.</i>
