- The position and power of an exalted person (a sovereign or bishop) who is entitled to sit in a chair of state on ceremonial occasions.
- A toilet.
- A ceremonial chair for a sovereign, bishop, or similar figure.
- The chair of state for a monarch, bishop, etc.
- A plumbing fixture for defecation and urination.
- (in traditional Christian angelology) the third-highest order of the ninefold celestial hierarchy.
- Used to signify sovereign power.
