Associations of "Through the wringer" (30 Words)

across	Used with an expression of measurement. <i>Halfway across Jenny jumped.</i>
along	Moving in a constant direction on a road, path, or any more or less horizontal surface. <i>I went along to see Ray.</i>
antipodal	Relating to or situated on the opposite side of the earth. <i>Antipodal regions of the earth.</i>
beyond	In addition. <i>She blurs the boundaries between reality and what lies beyond.</i>
breach	(of a whale) rise and break through the surface of the water. <i>We saw whales breaching in the distance.</i>
bye	A farewell remark. <i>He had a bye in the first round.</i>
crisscross	Crossing one another in opposite directions. <i>Wrinkles crisscrossed her face.</i>
cross	A cross shaped decoration awarded for personal valour or indicating rank in some orders of knighthood. <i>She has crossed the Atlantic twice.</i>
done	Cooked until ready to serve. <i>It s a done deed.</i>
elapse	(of time) pass or go by. <i>Three years elapsed.</i>
exceed	Go beyond what is allowed or stipulated by (a set limit). <i>Production costs have exceeded 60 000.</i>
finished	Brought to the desired final state. <i>A dazzling and finished piece of writing.</i>

hole	Hit the ball into the hole. <i>The dog had dug a hole in the ground.</i>
leaky	Permitting the unwanted passage of fluids or gases. <i>A leaky roof.</i>
<u>overcome</u>	Overcome as with emotions or perceptual stimuli. <i>She was obviously overcome with excitement.</i>
<u>overtake</u>	Catch up with and possibly overtake. <i>Germany rapidly overtook Britain in industrial output.</i>
pass	Pass over across or through. <i>The danger had passed.</i>
passageway	A long, narrow way, typically having walls either side, that allows access between buildings or to different rooms within a building. <i>Her hotel was at the end of a narrow passageway off the main street.</i>
penetrable	Capable of being penetrated. <i>The outer membrane is penetrable.</i>
permeable	(of a material or membrane) allowing liquids or gases to pass through it. <i>Rock that is permeable by water.</i>
porosity	The quality or degree of having minute spaces or holes through which liquid or air may pass. <i>Coated papers have zero porosity.</i>
porous	Allowing passage in and out. <i>Layers of porous limestones.</i>
<u>road</u>	A railroad. <i>A road accident.</i>
<u>seep</u>	A place where petroleum or water oozes slowly out of the ground. <i>Water began to seep through the soles of his boots.</i>
track	The act of participating in an athletic competition involving running on a track. <i>Follow the track to the farm.</i>
transcend	Be greater in scope or size than some standard. <i>This was an issue transcending party politics.</i>
transferability	The quality of being transferable or exchangeable. <i>Sterling transferability affords a means of multilateral settlement for trade between nondollar countries.</i>
transit	Revolve the telescope of a surveying transit about its horizontal transverse axis in order to reverse its direction. <i>The canal will transit hundreds of ships every day.</i>

traverse

An area of land surveyed with a traverse.

*The plaintiff must assert certain facts which if **traversed** he would be put to prove.*

visa

Provide a passport with a visa.

*An exit **visa**.*
