## Associations of "Through the wringer" (30 Words)

<a href="#">across</a>	Used with an expression of measurement. <i>Halfway <b>across</b> Jenny jumped.</i>
<b>along</b>	Moving in a constant direction on a road, path, or any more or less horizontal surface. <i>I went <b>along</b> to see Ray.</i>
<b>antipodal</b>	Relating to or situated on the opposite side of the earth. <i><b>Antipodal</b> regions of the earth.</i>
<a href="#">beyond</a>	In addition. <i>She blurs the boundaries between reality and what lies <b>beyond</b>.</i>
<b>breach</b>	(of a whale) rise and break through the surface of the water. <i>We saw whales <b>breaching</b> in the distance.</i>
<b>bye</b>	A farewell remark. <i>He had a <b>bye</b> in the first round.</i>
<b>crisscross</b>	Crossing one another in opposite directions. <i>Wrinkles <b>crisscrossed</b> her face.</i>
<a href="#">cross</a>	A cross shaped decoration awarded for personal valour or indicating rank in some orders of knighthood. <i>She has <b>crossed</b> the Atlantic twice.</i>
<b>done</b>	Cooked until ready to serve. <i>It s a <b>done</b> deed.</i>
<b>elapse</b>	(of time) pass or go by. <i>Three years <b>elapsed</b>.</i>
<a href="#">exceed</a>	Go beyond what is allowed or stipulated by (a set limit). <i>Production costs have <b>exceeded</b> 60 000.</i>
<b>finished</b>	Brought to the desired final state. <i>A dazzling and <b>finished</b> piece of writing.</i>

<b>hole</b>	Hit the ball into the hole. <i>The dog had dug a <b>hole</b> in the ground.</i>
<b>leaky</b>	Permitting the unwanted passage of fluids or gases. <i>A <b>leaky</b> roof.</i>
<b><u>overcome</u></b>	Overcome as with emotions or perceptual stimuli. <i>She was obviously <b>overcome</b> with excitement.</i>
<b><u>overtake</u></b>	Catch up with and possibly overtake. <i>Germany rapidly <b>overtook</b> Britain in industrial output.</i>
<b>pass</b>	Pass over across or through. <i>The danger had <b>passed</b>.</i>
<b>passageway</b>	A long, narrow way, typically having walls either side, that allows access between buildings or to different rooms within a building. <i>Her hotel was at the end of a narrow <b>passageway</b> off the main street.</i>
<b>penetrable</b>	Capable of being penetrated. <i>The outer membrane is <b>penetrable</b>.</i>
<b>permeable</b>	(of a material or membrane) allowing liquids or gases to pass through it. <i>Rock that is <b>permeable</b> by water.</i>
<b>porosity</b>	The quality or degree of having minute spaces or holes through which liquid or air may pass. <i>Coated papers have zero <b>porosity</b>.</i>
<b>porous</b>	Allowing passage in and out. <i>Layers of <b>porous</b> limestones.</i>
<b><u>road</u></b>	A railroad. <i>A <b>road</b> accident.</i>
<b><u>seep</u></b>	A place where petroleum or water oozes slowly out of the ground. <i>Water began to <b>seep</b> through the soles of his boots.</i>
<b>track</b>	The act of participating in an athletic competition involving running on a track. <i>Follow the <b>track</b> to the farm.</i>
<b>transcend</b>	Be greater in scope or size than some standard. <i>This was an issue <b>transcending</b> party politics.</i>
<b>transferability</b>	The quality of being transferable or exchangeable. <i>Sterling <b>transferability</b> affords a means of multilateral settlement for trade between nondollar countries.</i>
<b>transit</b>	Revolve the telescope of a surveying transit about its horizontal transverse axis in order to reverse its direction. <i>The canal will <b>transit</b> hundreds of ships every day.</i>

**traverse**

An area of land surveyed with a traverse.

*The plaintiff must assert certain facts which if **traversed** he would be put to prove.*

**visa**

Provide a passport with a visa.

*An exit **visa**.*
