give back	The elasticity of something that can be stretched and returns to its original length.
mirror	A thing regarded as accurately representing something else. The company now has a mirror site in Taiwan.



return	A coming to or returning home. The return of spring.
reversion	A property to which someone has the right of reversion. A reversion to the two party system.
shine back	The quality of being bright and sending out rays of light.
throw back	A single chance or instance.

Associations of "Throwback" (30 Words)

anachronism	Something located at a time when it could not have existed or occurred. <i>The town is a throwback to medieval times an</i> anachronism <i>that has survived the passing years.</i>
<u>antithesis</u>	Exact opposite. The antithesis between occult and rational mentalities.
atavism	A reappearance of an earlier characteristic. <i>The more civilized a society seems to be the more susceptible it is to its buried atavism.</i>



<u>back</u>	Cause to travel backward. He back ed the horse at 33 1.
backward	At or to or toward the back or rear. The child put her jersey on backward .
backwards	In reverse of the usual direction or order. <i>He took a step backwards.</i>
conflicting	Incompatible or at variance; contradictory. <i>Conflicting</i> opinions.
<u>contradictory</u>	A contradictory proposition. Politically he exhibited contradictory behaviour.
<u>contrary</u>	A contrary proposition. A contrary wind.
<u>converse</u>	Carry on a conversation. She was withdrawn and preoccupied hardly able to converse with her mother.
<u>inconsistency</u>	The relation between propositions that cannot both be true at the same time. The inconsistency between his expressed attitudes and his actual behaviour.
inverse	A reciprocal quantity, mathematical expression, geometric figure, etc. which is the result of inversion. <i>The age of such a universe is simply the</i> inverse <i>of the Hubble constant.</i>
inversion	A transformation in which each point of a given figure is replaced by another point on the same straight line from a fixed point especially in such a way that the product of the distances of the two points from the centre of inversion is constant. <i>The inversion</i> of the normal domestic arrangement.
opposing	Facing; opposite. The opposing team.
opposite	Of leaves or shoots arising in pairs at the same level on opposite sides of the stem. We were opposite s in temperament.
<u>oxymoron</u>	A figure of speech in which apparently contradictory terms appear in conjunction (e.g. faith unfaithful kept him falsely true).
<u>regression</u>	Returning to a former state. <i>Regression</i> therapy.
regressive	Relating to or marked by psychological regression. Regressive aspects of recent local government reform.



<u>relapse</u>	(of a sick or injured person) deteriorate after a period of improvement. <i>He relapsed.</i>
retreat	Make a retreat from an earlier commitment or activity. <i>A speedy retreat</i> .
retrograde	Show retrograde motion. The glacier retrograde s.
retrogression	Passing from a more complex to a simpler biological form. A retrogression to 19th century attitudes.
<u>retrospect</u>	A survey or review of a past course of events or period of time. A full retrospect of the battle.
return	Return to a previous position in mathematics. <i>The designer advocated a return to elegance.</i>
reversal	Turning in an opposite direction or position. A reversal by the House of Lords of the Court of Appeal s decision.
reversion	A property to which someone has the right of reversion. A problem applicable to most variegated plants is that of reversion .
<u>revolutionize</u>	Change radically. <i>This fabulous new theory will revolutionize the whole of science.</i>
similar	A person or thing similar to another. <i>The principle of treatment by similars.</i>
turnabout	A decision to reverse an earlier decision. The move was a significant turnabout for the company.
<u>turnaround</u>	Turning in the opposite direction. Short hops with quick turnaround s and limited in flight service.
