## Associations of "Thrown" (30 Words)

<b>capsize</b>	Cause (a boat) to overturn. <i>Do you know what to do in the event of a <b>capsize</b>.</i>
<b>cast</b>	Make a moulded object by casting metal. <i>You can look at the star chart <b>cast</b> at somebody s birth.</i>
<b>chuck</b>	Throw carelessly. <i>People <b>chuck</b> an incredible 40 per cent of all food we produce.</i>
<b>dart</b>	A small pointed missile with a feather or plastic flight used in the game of darts. <i>He <b>darted</b> the leopard with a long acting anaesthetic.</i>
<b>dash</b>	Come into forceful contact with something. <i>I must <b>dash</b> I m late.</i>
<b>dice</b>	A game played with dice. <i><b>Dice</b> the peppers.</i>
<b>discus</b>	A small colourful South American freshwater fish with a rounded laterally compressed body, native to South America and popular in aquariums.
<b>dispose</b>	Arrange in a particular position. <i>People now have substantial assets to <b>dispose</b> of after their death.</i>
<b>fling</b>	The act of flinging. <i>I had a <b>fling</b> with someone when I was at college.</i>
<b>flip</b>	Glib or flippant. <i>He couldn t get away with <b>flip</b> funny conversation.</i>
<b>flirt</b>	A person who habitually flirts. <i>The lark was <b>flirting</b> around the site.</i>
<b>flit</b>	A sudden quick movement. <i>They did a moonlight <b>flit</b>.</i>
<b>hurl</b>	A violent throw. <i>The demonstrators <b>hurled</b> abuse at councillors.</i>

<b>hurtle</b>	Make a thrusting forward movement. <i>The cars <b>hurtled</b> by.</i>
<b>invert</b>	An arch constructed in an upside-down position to provide lateral support, e.g. in a tunnel. <i>When forming a question <b>invert</b> the subject and the verb.</i>
<b><u>juggle</u></b>	Influence by slyness. <i>She had to <b>juggle</b> her job and her children.</i>
<b><u>juggling</u></b>	The act of rearranging things to give a misleading impression.
<b>ogle</b>	Stare at in a lecherous manner. <i>A vaguely erotic <b>ogle</b>.</i>
<b>pebble</b>	A small stone made smooth and round by the action of water or sand. <i>A narrow <b>pebble</b> beach.</i>
<b>somersault</b>	Perform a somersault or make a similar movement accidentally. <i>His car <b>somersaulted</b> into a ditch.</i>
<b>spending</b>	The act of spending or disbursing money.
<b><u>spew</u></b>	Vomit. <i>The volcano <b>spews</b> out molten rocks every day.</i>
<b><u>spin</u></b>	Fish with a spinner. <i><b>Spin</b> silk.</i>
<b>splurge</b>	An ostentatious display (of effort or extravagance etc). <i>I <b>splurged</b> on a new TV.</i>
<b>toss</b>	The action of tossing a coin as a method of deciding which team has the right to make a particular decision at the beginning of a game. <i><b>Toss</b> the salad.</i>
<b>turnover</b>	The volume measured in dollars. <i>An annual <b>turnover</b> of staff as high as 100.</i>
<b><u>unload</u></b>	Leave or unload. <i>The street was jammed with vans <b>unloading</b>.</i>
<b>wastebasket</b>	A waste-paper basket.
<b><u>wasteful</u></b>	Laying waste- Shakespeare. <i><b>Wasteful</b> duplication of effort.</i>
<b><u>whirl</u></b>	The shape of something rotating rapidly. <i>Sybil stood waving as they <b>whirled</b> past.</i>
