Associations of "Thrown" (30 Words)

capsize	Cause (a boat) to overturn. <i>Do you know what to do in the event of a capsize.</i>
cast	Make a moulded object by casting metal. <i>You can look at the star chart cast at somebody's birth.</i>
chuck	Throw carelessly. <i>People chuck an incredible 40 per cent of all food we produce.</i>
dart	A small pointed missile with a feather or plastic flight used in the game of darts. <i>He darted the leopard with a long acting anaesthetic.</i>
dash	Come into forceful contact with something. <i>I must dash I'm late.</i>
dice	A game played with dice. <i>Dice the peppers.</i>
discus	A small colourful South American freshwater fish with a rounded laterally compressed body, native to South America and popular in aquariums.
dispose	Arrange in a particular position. <i>People now have substantial assets to dispose of after their death.</i>
fling	The act of flinging. <i>I had a fling with someone when I was at college.</i>
flip	Glib or flippant. <i>He couldn't get away with flip funny conversation.</i>
flirt	A person who habitually flirts. <i>The lark was flirting around the site.</i>
flit	A sudden quick movement. <i>They did a moonlight flit.</i>
hurl	A violent throw. <i>The demonstrators hurled abuse at councillors.</i>

hurtle	Make a thrusting forward movement. <i>The cars hurtled by.</i>
invert	An arch constructed in an upside-down position to provide lateral support, e.g. in a tunnel. <i>When forming a question invert the subject and the verb.</i>
juggle	Influence by slyness. <i>She had to juggle her job and her children.</i>
juggling	The act of rearranging things to give a misleading impression.
ogle	Stare at in a lecherous manner. <i>A vaguely erotic ogle.</i>
pebble	A small stone made smooth and round by the action of water or sand. <i>A narrow pebble beach.</i>
somersault	Perform a somersault or make a similar movement accidentally. <i>His car somersaulted into a ditch.</i>
spending	The act of spending or disbursing money.
spew	Vomit. <i>The volcano spews out molten rocks every day.</i>
spin	Fish with a spinner. <i>Spin silk.</i>
splurge	An ostentatious display (of effort or extravagance etc). <i>I splurged on a new TV.</i>
toss	The action of tossing a coin as a method of deciding which team has the right to make a particular decision at the beginning of a game. <i>Toss the salad.</i>
turnover	The volume measured in dollars. <i>An annual turnover of staff as high as 100.</i>
unload	Leave or unload. <i>The street was jammed with vans unloading.</i>
wastebasket	A waste-paper basket.
wasteful	Laying waste- Shakespeare. <i>Wasteful duplication of effort.</i>
whirl	The shape of something rotating rapidly. <i>Sybil stood waving as they whirled past.</i>
