| <b>farther</b>      | To or at a greater distance in time or space farther is used more frequently than further in this physical sense.<br><i><b>Farther</b> from the truth.</i> |
| <b>forth</b>        | From a particular thing or place or position forth is obsolete.<br><i>We rose at dawn and sallied <b>forth</b>.</i>  |
| <b>further</b>      | In addition or furthermore.<br><i><b>Further</b> from our expectations.</i>  |
| <b>galaxy</b>       | The galaxy of which the solar system is a part the Milky Way.<br><i>The four musicians have played with a <b>galaxy</b> of stars.</i>                      |
| <b>going</b>        | Conditions for, or progress in, an endeavour.<br><i>Persuading him was easy <b>going</b>.</i>  |

| <b>secluded</b>     | Providing privacy or seclusion.<br><i>The gardens are quiet and <b>secluded</b>.</i>   |
