smart	Showing impertinence by making clever or sarcastic remarks. <i>I gave him a smart salute.</i>
spruce	Marked by up-to-dateness in dress and manners.
<u>straight</u>	Simple straightforward. <i>Straight reasoning.</i>
<u>substantial</u>	Of considerable importance, size, or worth. <i>Ate a substantial breakfast.</i>
trim	Severely simple in line or design. <i>A trim little villa.</i>
uncluttered	Having nothing extraneous. <i>The rooms were plain and uncluttered.</i>
well arranged	Resulting favorably.
well groomed	Wise or advantageous and hence advisable.
well kept	In good health especially after having suffered illness or injury.

orderly	Neatly and methodically arranged. <i>An orderly arrangement of objects.</i>
<u>pristine</u>	Clean and fresh as if new; spotless. <i>A pristine white shirt.</i>
<u>refined</u>	Developed or improved so as to be precise or subtle. <i>Due to the limitations of the available tools a more refined analysis of the data may be necessary.</i>
regular	A regular member of the armed forces. <i>Her breathing became more regular.</i>
shipshape	In good order; trim and neat. <i>He checked that everything was shipshape.</i>
sizing	Any glutinous material used to fill pores in surfaces or to stiffen fabrics.
smashing	The act of breaking something into small pieces. <i>You look simply smashing.</i>
<u>systematic</u>	Done or acting according to a fixed plan or system; methodical. <i>A systematic administrator.</i>

- thorough** Performed or written with great care and completeness.
*Officers have made a **thorough** examination of the wreckage.*
- trim** Adjust the balance of a ship or aircraft by rearranging its cargo or by means of its trim tabs.
***Trim** the photograph.*
- unspoiled** Not spoiled, in particular (of a place) not marred by development.
*One of the best stretches of **unspoiled** coastline in the UK.*
- washing** The action of washing oneself or laundering clothes bed linen etc.
*Avoid over enthusiastic **washing**.*

*Paul **wiped** his face with a handkerchief.*
